3	It is hereby enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Vermont:
4	Sec. 1. ENERGY TRANSITION ECONOMIC IMPACTS REPORT
5	(a) On or before December 15, 2025, the Secretary of Natural Resources, in
6	consultation with the relevant State agencies, including the Agency of
7	Agriculture, Food and Markets, the Department of Public Service, the Agency
8	of Transportation, the Department of Labor, the Agency of Commerce and
9	Community Development, and the Department of Taxes, shall publish a report
10	that highlights existing data sources and indicators relevant to the impacts of
11	the changing energy landscape on Vermonters and relevant to understanding
12	the distribution of benefits and burdens by region.
13	(b) The report shall provide data for the previous five years. The report
14	shall include:
15	(1) current and forecasted electric rates and the number of customers
16	with electric vehicle rates;
17	(2) the total megawatts of distributed solar generation facilities,
18	including the amount installed, by county and any active certificate of public
19	good applications;
20	(3) the number of sellers and volume of heating fuel sales;

1	(4) the number of homes receiving incentivized weatherization services,
2	by income level and county;
3	(5) firms and workers in thermal and renewable energy sector trades;
4	(6) gasoline and diesel transportation fuel sales;
5	(7) the number and location of retail gasoline and diesel outlets as
6	indicated by metered pumps;
7	(8) progress in electric vehicle supply equipment installation, both fast
8	charging and Level 2, to meet recommendations in the Comprehensive Energy
9	Plan and Climate Action Plan and their locations;
10	(9) vehicle registrations by fuel type for light, medium, and heavy-duty
11	vehicles; and
12	(10) fossil fuel and electricity consumption per unit of economic output.
13	(c) The report shall also include:
14	(1) regional distribution and graphic displays of the data compiled;
15	(2) an analysis of the data and recommendations of any additional data
16	necessary to illustrate the impacts of the changing energy landscape by region;
17	(3) an identification of existing reports and requirements that may
18	support the reporting of relevant indicators;
19	(4) consideration of equity and just transition indicators, with the goal of
20	better understanding the benefits and burdens of the changing energy
21	landscape by region; and
