13	Subject: Conservation and development; real property; trail use; compensation
14	Statement of purpose of bill as introduced: This bill proposes to establish the
15	Recreational Trails Compensation Study Committee to review and recommend
16	to the General Assembly whether real property owners who allow use of their
17	property for public recreational trails should receive compensation or other
18	benefit.

An act relating to establishing the Recreational Trails Compensation Study

1	It is hereby enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Vermont:
2	Sec. 1. RECREATIONAL TRAILS COMPENSATION STUDY
3	COMMITTEE; REPORT
4	(a) Creation. There is created the Recreational Trails Compensation Study
5	Committee to review whether real property owners who allow use of their
6	property for public recreational trails should receive compensation or other
7	benefit.
8	(b) Membership.
9	(1) The Recreational Trails Compensation Study Committee shall be
10	composed of the following members:
11	(A) the Commissioner of Forests, Parks and Recreation or designee;
12	(B) the Commissioner of Taxes or designees;
13	(C) a representative of the Vermont Trails and Greenways Council,
14	appointed by the Governor;
15	(D) a representative of the Vermont Outdoor Recreation Economic
16	Collaborative, appointed by the Speaker of the House;
17	(E) a representative of a land conservation organization, appointed by
18	the Committee on Committees;
19	(F) a private landowner who has a conservation easement that
20	includes recreation, appointed by the Governor;

1	(G) a private landowner who does not have a conservation easement
2	on the land and currently provides public access, appointed by the Speaker of
3	the House;
4	(H) a representative who has expertise in trail planning, design,
5	building, and maintenance, appointed by the Committee on Committees; and
6	(I) a representative of the Vermont League of Cities and Towns,
7	appointed by the Governor.
8	(2) The Study Committee may invite other entities to participate in the
9	conduct of the study as non-voting participants.
10	(c) Powers and duties. The Recreational Trails Compensation Study
11	Committee shall:
12	(1) review how private property currently is made available for use by
13	public recreational trails;
14	(2) summarize the costs and liabilities that private property owners incur
15	when private property is used by public recreational trails;
16	(3) assess available economic data and other relevant available data or
17	analysis and conduct further necessary economic analysis to determine the
18	value that recreational trail access provides to the State and to local economies;
19	(4) investigate whether and how private property owners in other
20	jurisdictions are compensated for allowing use of property for public
21	recreational trails or other public outdoor recreation;

1	(5) recommend to the General Assembly whether real property owners
2	who allow use of their property for public recreational trails should receive
3	compensation or other benefit and, if so, the source of the compensation or
4	other benefit;
5	(6) how to ensure trail siting, design, construction, and management
6	meet minimum standards; and
7	(7) how to ensure that new trail development is established based on the
8	merit of the opportunity being created in comparison to any incentive provided
9	to a private landowner.
10	(d) Assistance. The Recreational Trails Compensation Study Committee
11	shall have the administrative, technical, and legal assistance of the Department
12	of Forests, Parks and Recreation.
13	(e) Report. On or before December 15, 2026, the Recreational Trails
14	Compensation Study Committee shall submit a written report to the General
15	Assembly with its findings and any recommendations for legislative action.
16	(f) Meetings.
17	(1) The Commissioner of Forests, Parks and Recreation or designee
18	shall call the first meeting of the Recreational Trails Compensation Study
19	Committee to occur on or before September 15, 2025.
20	(2) The Commissioner of Forests, Parks and Recreation or designee
21	shall be the chair of the Study Committee.

1	(3) A majority of the membership shall constitute a quorum.
2	(4) The Committee shall cease to exist on March 1, 2027.
3	(g) Compensation and reimbursement. Members of the Committee shall be
4	entitled to per diem compensation and reimbursement of expenses as permitted
5	under 32 V.S.A. § 1010 for not more than six meetings. These payments shall
6	be made from monies appropriated to the Agency of Natural Resources.
7	(h) Appropriation for Committee consulting. In addition to other funds
8	appropriated to the Department of Forests, Parks and Recreation in fiscal year
9	2026, the sum of \$250,000.00 is appropriated to the Department from the
10	General Fund in fiscal year 2026 to:
11	(1) contract with one or more consultants to assist with the required
12	evaluation of the economic impact of the outdoor recreation industry on the
13	economy of Vermont; and
14	(2) support the powers and duties of the Study Committee on
15	development of the report required under this section.
16	Sec. 2. EFFECTIVE DATE
17	This act shall take effect on July 1, 2025.
