10	Statement of purpose of bill as introduced: This bill proposes to implement the
11	Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program's Restaurant Meals Program in
12	Vermont.

14	It is hereby enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Vermont:
15	* * * Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program Generally * * *
16	Sec. 1. 33 V.S.A. § 1701 is amended to read:
17	§ 1701. SUPPLEMENTAL NUTRITION ASSISTANCE PROGRAM
18	(a) The State of Vermont may shall participate in the federal Supplemental
19	Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP) pursuant to 7 U.S.C. chapter 51. The
20	purpose of SNAP is to alleviate hunger and malnutrition among households

1	with low income by increasing their food purchasing power and access to
2	nutritious, safe food.

4	* * * Restaurant Meals Program * * *
5	Sec. 2. 33 V.S.A. § 1704 is added to read:
6	§ 1704. RESTAURANT MEALS PROGRAM
7	(a) The State shall participate in the Supplemental Nutrition Assistance
8	Program's Restaurant Meals Program. The Restaurant Meals Program shall be
9	administered by the Agency of Human Services, in consultation with the
10	Agency of Commerce and Community Development.
11	(b) Restaurant participation in the Restaurant Meals Program shall be
12	voluntary. The Agency of Human Services, in consultation with the Agency of
13	Commerce and Community Development, shall develop and publish on its
14	website a list of eligibility criteria for restaurant participation in the Restaurant
15	Meals Program, including that participating restaurants are licensed pursuant to
16	18 V.S.A. chapter 85. The eligibility criteria shall advance the following
17	goals:
18	(1) Locally produced foods are widely available to Restaurant Meals
19	Program clients.
20	(2) Restaurants serving foods that represent diverse cultural traditions
21	participate in the Restaurant Meals Program.

1	(3) Participating restaurants are located in geographically diverse
2	regions of the State and in areas with significant populations of eligible
3	program participants.
4	(c) The Agency of Human Services, in consultation with the Agency of
5	Commerce and Community Development, shall provide technical assistance to
6	those restaurants applying to and participating in the Restaurant Meals
7	Program.
8	Sec. 3. ADOPTION OF RESRATAURANT MEALS PROGRAM
9	The Agency of Human Services shall work in collaboration with the U.S.
10	Department of Agriculture's Food and Nutrition Service to adopt the
11	Restaurant Meals Program in Vermont pursuant to 33 V.S.A. § 1704.
12	Documents submitted to the Food and Nutrition Services shall include a
13	comprehensive implementation plan describing criteria for participating
14	restaurants and a template of the memorandum of understanding that shall be
15	used by the Agency and participating restaurants.
16	Sec. 4. POSITION AUTHORIZATION; APPROPRIATION; RESTAURANT
17	MEALS PROGRAM
18	(a) In fiscal year 2026, one new permanent classified position, Restaurant
19	Meals Program Coordinator, is authorized for establishment within the Agency
20	of Human Services.

1	(b) In fiscal year 2026, \$100,000.00 is appropriated from the General Fund
2	to the Agency of Human Services to support the position established in
3	subsection (a) of this section. The position shall provide technical assistance to
4	restaurants applying to and participating in the Restaurant Meals Program
5	pursuant to Sec. 2 of this act and to Supplemental Nutrition Assistance
6	Program retailers generally.
7	(c) In fiscal year 2026, \$75,000.00 is appropriated from the General Fund
8	to the Agency of Human Services to cover equipment and restaurant start-up
9	costs related to restaurant participation in the Restaurant Meals Program
10	pursuant to Sec. 2 of this act.
