12	Statement of purpose of bill as introduced: This bill proposes to waive 100
13	percent or 50 percent of the registration fee for certain motor vehicles upon
14	proof that the registered owner or co-owner is a veteran who received a
15	discharge under other than dishonorable conditions.
16	An act relating to reduced motor vehicle registration fees for veterans
17	It is hereby enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Vermont:
18	Sec. 1. 23 V.S.A. § 378 is amended to read:
19	§ 378. VETERANS' EXEMPTIONS

(a) No fees shall be charged an honorably discharged to a veteran of the
U.S. Armed Forces who received a discharge under other than dishonorable
conditions and is a resident of the State of Vermont for the registration of a
motor vehicle that the veteran has acquired with financial assistance from the
U.S. Department of Veterans Affairs, or for the registration of a motor vehicle
owned by him or her the veteran during his or her the veteran's lifetime
obtained as a replacement thereof, when his or her the veteran's application is
accompanied by a copy of an approved VA Form 21-4502 issued by the U.S.
Department of Veterans Affairs certifying him or her the veteran to be entitled
to the financial assistance.
(b) A veteran of the U.S. Armed Forces who received a discharge under
other than dishonorable conditions and is a resident of the State of Vermont
shall be entitled to a 50 percent reduction of the registration fees owed under
sections 361 (pleasure cars), 364 (motorcycles), 364a (motor-driven cycles),
364b (all-surface vehicles), 373 (exhibition vehicles), 382 (diesel-powered
pleasure cars), 3204 (snowmobiles), 3204a (antique snowmobiles),
3305 (motorboats), and 3504 (all-terrain vehicles) of this title and 3 V.S.A.
§ 2822(m) (Clean Air Fund) when the veteran's registration form or renewal
registration form is accompanied by a copy of an approved DD Form 214.
This reduction in registration fees shall be available if the veteran is listed as

1	an owner or co-owner of the motor vehicle on any registration forms filed with
2	the Department of Motor Vehicles.
3	(c) Notwithstanding subsection (b) of this section, a veteran of the U.S.
4	Armed Forces who received a discharge under other than dishonorable
5	conditions and is a resident of the State of Vermont shall be entitled to one 100
6	percent reduction of the registration fees listed in subsection (b) per calendar
7	year when the veteran's registration form or renewal registration form is
8	accompanied by a copy of an approved DD Form 214, provided that the
9	veteran is not already receiving a fee exemption under subsection (a) of this
10	section. This reduction in registration fees shall be available if the veteran is
11	listed as an owner or co-owner of the motor vehicle on any registration forms
12	filed with the Department of Motor Vehicles.
