| 6  | Statement of purpose of bill as introduced: This bill proposes to establish the    |
| 7  | Vermont State Building Security Board; transfer responsibility for security in     |
| 8  | all State facilities except the State House to the Vermont State Building          |
| 9  | Security Board; and establish the Buildings and Courthouses Police                 |
| 10 | Department.  |
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| 11 | An act relating to the creation of the Vermont State Building Security Board       |
| 12 | It is hereby enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Vermont:              |
| 13 | Sec. 1. 29 V.S.A. § 171 is amended to read:  |
| 14 | § 171. RESPONSIBILITY FOR SECURITY   |
| 15 | (a) The Commissioner of Buildings and General Services Vermont State               |
| 16 | Building Security Board shall be responsible for ensuring the security of all      |
| 17 | State facilities, regardless of funding source for construction or renovation, the |
| 18 | lands upon which those facilities are located, and the occupants of those          |
| 19 | facilities and places, and State-owned or State-leased buildings that house a      |
| 20 | court plus one or more other functions, in those buildings that function           |

| 1  | exclusively as courthouses, and the space occupied by the Supreme Court,        |
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| 2  | except that:  |
| 3  | (1) in those State owned or State leased buildings that house a court plus      |
| 4  | one or more other functions, security for the space occupied by the court shall |
| 5  | be under the jurisdiction of the Supreme Court and security elsewhere shall be  |
| 6  | under the jurisdiction of the Commissioner of Buildings and General Services;   |
| 7  | (2) in those buildings which function exclusively as courthouses, security      |
| 8  | shall be under the jurisdiction of the Supreme Court;                           |
| 9  | (3) the space occupied by the Supreme Court shall be under the                  |
| 10 | jurisdiction of the Supreme Court; and  |
| 11 | (4) in the State House, security shall be under the jurisdiction of the         |
| 12 | Sergeant at Arms.   |
| 13 | (b) The Commissioner of Buildings and General Services Vermont State            |
| 14 | Building Security Board shall develop a security plan for each facility, except |
| 15 | for those under the jurisdiction of the Supreme Court and of the Sergeant at    |
| 16 | Arms State House, and shall regularly update these plans as necessary and be    |
| 17 | responsible for coordinating responses to all security needs. The Supreme       |
| 18 | Court and the Sergeant at Arms shall, in cooperation with the Commissioner of   |
| 19 | Buildings and General Services Vermont State Building Security Board,           |
| 20 | prepare and update such plans for the facilities under their respective         |
| 21 | jurisdictions the Sergeant at Arms' jurisdiction.                               |

| 1  | (c) The Commissioner of Buildings and General Services Vermont State              |
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| 2  | Building Security Board may delegate the responsibility for security at           |
| 3  | specified facilities.   |
| 4  | (d) All security improvements to State facilities shall be under the direction    |
| 5  | of the Commissioner of Buildings and General Services Vermont State               |
| 6  | Building Security Board, who which shall set statewide standards for policies,    |
| 7  | materials, and equipment, including voice and data reception and transmission     |
| 8  | upgrades and installations.   |
| 9  | (e) Under this section, the Commissioner of Buildings and General                 |
| 10 | Services Vermont State Building Security Board is responsible for the             |
| 11 | protection of State facilities, the lands upon which the facilities are situated, |
| 12 | and the occupants of those facilities, which is vital to sustaining the essential |
| 13 | services of government in an emergency. The Commissioner Board shall              |
| 14 | develop plans for continuity of government and continuity of operations as an     |
| 15 | addendum to the State emergency operations plan maintained by the                 |
| 16 | Department of Public Safety, Division of Emergency Management and                 |
| 17 | referenced in 20 V.S.A. § 8(b)(2).  |
| 18 | (f) The Commissioner of Buildings and General Services, Vermont State             |
| 19 | Building Security Board and the Sergeant at Arms, and the Court                   |
| 20 | Administrator shall execute a memorandum of understanding to coordinate the       |
| 21 | provision of security plans and law enforcement services within the Capitol       |

| 1  | Complex. The memorandum of understanding shall incorporate any existing        |
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| 2  | agreements related to the provision of law enforcement services or security in |
| 3  | the Capitol Complex. As used in this section, "Capitol Complex" has the same   |
| 4  | meaning as used in section 182 of this title.                                  |
| 5  | Sec. 2. 29 V.S.A. § 173 is added to read:                                      |
| 6  | § 173. VERMONT STATE BUILDING SECURITY BOARD                                   |
| 7  | (a) The Vermont State Building Security Board is established to oversee        |
| 8  | the safety and security of worksites for Vermont State employees and the       |
| 9  | employees of the Judiciary.  |
| 10 | (b)(1) The Board shall consist of the following seven members:                 |
| 11 | (A) two members, appointed by the Governor;                                    |
| 12 | (B) the Vermont State Court Administrator or designee;                         |
| 13 | (C) one member, appointed by the Attorney General; and                         |
| 14 | (D) three members, appointed by the President of the Vermont State             |
| 15 | Employees' Association.  |
| 16 | (2) The Board shall annually, from among its membership, elect a               |
| 17 | member to serve as Board chair and a member to serve as Board vice chair.      |
| 18 | (3) The members of the Board shall serve terms of six years and may            |
| 19 | serve not more than two consecutive terms. All appointments shall be made      |
| 20 | between January 1 and February 1 of each odd-numbered year, except to fill a   |
| 21 | vacancy. Members shall serve until their successors are appointed.             |

| (4) Membership on the Board does not constitute the holding of an                 |
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| office for any purpose, and members of the Board shall not be required to take    |
| and file oaths of office before serving on the Board. A member of the Board       |
| shall not be disqualified from holding any public office or employment and        |
| shall not forfeit any office or employment by reason of the member's              |
| appointment to the Board, notwithstanding any statute, ordinance, or charter to   |
| the contrary.   |
| (c) The Board shall hold at least four regular meetings a year. Meetings of       |
| the Board may be held at any time or place within Vermont upon call of the        |
| Chair or a majority of the members, after reasonable notice to the other          |
| members, and shall be held at such times and places as in the judgment of the     |
| Board will best serve the convenience of all parties in interest. The Board shall |
| adopt rules and procedures with respect to the conduct of its meetings and        |
| other affairs.  |
| (d) Members who are not State employees or not otherwise compensated in           |
| the course of their employment shall receive per diem compensation and            |
| expense reimbursement for meetings in accordance with the provisions of           |
| 32 V.S.A. § 1010. Members who receive per diem shall receive compensation         |
| for not more than 12 meetings per year.   |
| (e) The Board shall appoint the Director of Safety and Security who shall         |
| hold office at the pleasure of the Board. The Director shall:                     |

| 1  | (1) Develop and implement, annually, a comprehensive plan to ensure           |
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| 2  | security for State and Vermont Judiciary employees.                           |
| 3  | (2) Compile an annual report on the number and type of security               |
| 4  | incidents concerning State employees and the employees of the Vermont         |
| 5  | Judiciary. This report shall be provided annually to the House Committees on  |
| 6  | Corrections and Institutions and on Government Operations and Military        |
| 7  | Affairs and the Senate Committees on Government Operations and on             |
| 8  | <u>Institutions.</u>  |
| 9  | (3) Perform such duties as may be assigned by the Board.                      |
| 10 | (f) The Director of Safety and Security is entitled to compensation, as       |
| 11 | established by law, and reimbursement for the expenses within the amounts     |
| 12 | available by appropriation. The Director of Safety and Security may, with the |
| 13 | approval of the Board, hire employees to fulfill the duties outlined in       |
| 14 | subsection (e) of this section. These employees shall be classified State     |
| 15 | employees.  |
| 16 | (g) The Director of Safety and Security shall partner with the Department     |
| 17 | of Buildings and General Services, whose staff shall be responsible for the   |
| 18 | installation, maintenance, and replacement of physical plant alterations      |
| 19 | necessary for the implementation of the Director's security plan.             |

| 1  | Sec. 3. 29 V.S.A. § 174 is added to read:                                    |
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| 2  | § 174. BUILDINGS AND COURTHOUSES POLICE DEPARTMENT                           |
| 3  | (a) Definitions. As used in this section:                                    |
| 4  | (1) "Courthouse" means a building or any portion of a building               |
| 5  | designated by the Supreme Court of Vermont as a courthouse.                  |
| 6  | (2) "State building" means a building or any portion of a building           |
| 7  | designated by the Director of Safety and Security, in consultation with the  |
| 8  | Commissioner of Buildings and General Services, as a State building.         |
| 9  | (b) Creation. The Buildings and Courthouses Police Department is created     |
| 10 | within the Department of Public Safety. The Commissioner of Public Safety    |
| 11 | shall appoint and may remove, at the Commissioner's pleasure, a Buildings    |
| 12 | and Courthouses Police Department officer to serve as Chief. The Chief shall |
| 13 | be an exempt State employee and shall appoint individuals to serve as        |
| 14 | additional Buildings and Courthouses Police Department officers. All such    |
| 15 | positions shall be classified State employees. The Chief shall supervise the |
| 16 | officer force. Such appointments and all oaths or affirmations shall be in   |
| 17 | writing and filed with the Commissioner of Public Safety.                    |
| 18 | (c) Powers; training.  |
| 19 | (1) A Buildings and Courthouses Police Department officer shall have         |
| 20 | all the same powers and authority as sheriffs and other law enforcement      |
| 21 | officers anywhere in the State, which shall include the authority to arrest  |

| 1  | persons and enforce the civil and criminal laws, keep the peace, provide      |
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| 2  | security, and serve civil and criminal process. For this purpose, a Buildings |
| 3  | and Courthouses Police Department officer shall subscribe to the same oaths   |
| 4  | required for sheriffs.  |
| 5  | (2) Notwithstanding any other provision of law to the contrary, a             |
| 6  | Buildings and Courthouses Police Department officer shall be a Level II or    |
| 7  | Level III law enforcement officer certified by the Vermont Criminal Justice   |
| 8  | Training Council pursuant to the provisions of 20 V.S.A. chapter 151, except  |
| 9  | that the Chief of the Buildings and Courthouses Police Department shall be a  |
| 10 | Level III certified law enforcement officer.                                  |
| 11 | (d) Coordination of State building and courthouse security. The Buildings     |
| 12 | and Courthouses Police Department shall provide security and law              |
| 13 | enforcement services for State buildings and courthouses.                     |
| 14 | Sec. 4. EFFECTIVE DATE  |
| 15 | This act shall take effect on July 1, 2025.                                   |
