1	(2) When, due to insufficient light or unfavorable atmospheric weather
2	conditions, persons or vehicles on the highway are not clearly discernible at a
3	distance of 500 feet ahead, shall display lighted lamps and illuminating devices
4	as respectively required for different classes of vehicles, subject to exceptions
5	with respect to parked vehicles including when persons or vehicles on the
6	highway in front of the vehicle are not clearly discernible due to rain, snow,
7	fog, dust, smoke, or other particulate matter.

14	(a) Every motor vehicle, trailer, semi-trailer, and pole trailer, and any other
15	vehicle that is being drawn at the end of a combination of vehicles, shall be
16	equipped with at least two red taillamps mounted on the rear that emit light
17	that is visible at a distance of 300 feet behind the vehicle, except that one
18	taillamp shall be allowed on any vehicle equipped with only one when it was
19	manufactured. Nothing shall be towed behind a motor vehicle, or mounted or
20	placed on the rear of a motor vehicle, trailer, semi-trailer, pole trailer, or any
21	other vehicle that is being drawn at the end of a combination of vehicles, that
