2 An act relating to issuing immunization recommendations

3 It is hereby enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Vermont:

8 (a) As used in this section:

11 vaccine or other immunizing agent that provides protection against a particular
12 disease or pathogen and the application of the ~~vaccines~~ immunization as
13 recommended by the practice guidelines for children and adults established by
14 the ~~Advisory Committee on Immunization Practices (ACIP) to the Centers for~~
15 ~~Disease Control and Prevention (CDC)~~ Commissioner pursuant to section
16 1130a of this title.

18 (b)(1) The Department of ~~Health~~ shall administer an immunization
19 program with the goals of ensuring universal access to ~~vaccines~~ recommended
20 immunizations for all Vermonters at no charge to the individual and reducing
21 the cost at which the State may purchase ~~vaccines~~ recommended
22 immunizations. The Department shall purchase, provide for the distribution of,

1 and monitor the use of ~~vaccines~~ recommended immunizations as provided for
2 in this subsection and subsection (c) of this section. The cost of the ~~vaccines~~
3 recommended immunizations and an administrative surcharge shall be
4 reimbursed by health insurers as provided for in subsections (e) and (f) of this
5 section.

6 (2) The Department shall solicit, facilitate, and supervise the
7 participation of health care professionals, health care facilities, and health
8 insurers in the immunization program in order to accomplish the State's goal
9 of universal access to recommended immunizations at the lowest practicable
10 cost to individuals, insurers, and State health care programs.

11 (3) The Department shall gather and analyze data regarding the
12 immunization program for the purpose of ensuring its quality and maximizing
13 protection of Vermonters against diseases preventable by ~~vaccination~~
14 immunization.

15 (c) The Department shall determine which recommended immunizations
16 shall be purchased under the program. The immunization program shall
17 purchase ~~vaccines~~ recommended immunizations consistent with the goals of
18 the program from the federal Centers for Disease Control and Prevention or
19 another vendor at the lowest available cost. ~~The Department shall determine~~
20 ~~annually which vaccines for adults shall be purchased under the program.~~

1 (d) The immunization program shall provide for distribution of the
2 ~~vaccines~~ recommended immunizations to health care professionals and health
3 care facilities for administration to patients.

4 (e) Health insurers shall remit to the Department the cost of ~~vaccines~~
5 recommended immunizations, as established by the Commissioner ~~of Health~~
6 based on the recommendation of the Immunization Funding Advisory
7 Committee established in subsection (g) of this section.

8 (f) The Department shall charge each health insurer a surcharge for the
9 costs and administration of the immunization program. The surcharge shall be
10 deposited into an existing special fund and used solely for the purpose of
11 administering the program.

12 (g)(1) The Immunization Funding Advisory Committee is established to
13 provide the Commissioner ~~of Health~~ with an annual per-member per-month
14 cost for ~~vaccines~~ recommended immunizations for the pediatric population, an
15 annual per-member per-month cost for ~~vaccines~~ recommended immunizations
16 for the adult population, and a recommendation for the amount of the yearly
17 ~~vaccine~~ immunization assessment. The Committee shall comprise the
18 following nine members:

19 (A) the Executive Officer of the Board of Pharmacy or designee;

20 (B) the Executive Director of the Green Mountain Care Board or
21 designee;

1 (C) a representative, appointed by the Director of the Vermont
2 Blueprint for Health, ~~nominated by the Director of the Blueprint and appointed~~
3 ~~by the Commissioner of Health;~~

4 (D) three representatives of health insurers, one ~~from each of each~~
5 appointed by the State's largest three private health insurers, as determined by
6 the number of covered lives, ~~appointed by the Commissioner of Health;~~

7 (E) a representative, appointed by the Vermont chapter of the
8 American Academy of Pediatrics, ~~Vermont chapter, appointed by the~~
9 ~~Commissioner of Health;~~

10 (F) a representative, appointed by the Vermont chapter of the
11 American Academy of Family Medicine, ~~Vermont chapter, appointed by the~~
12 ~~Commissioner of Health;~~ and

13 (G) a representative of employers that self-insure for health coverage,
14 appointed by the Commissioner of Health.

15 (2) The Committee shall select a chair from among its members at the
16 first meeting of each calendar year. The Committee shall receive
17 administrative and technical support from the Department ~~of Health.~~

18 (3) ~~By~~ On or before January 1 of each year, the Committee shall provide
19 to the Commissioner the annual fiscal assessment and the per-member per-
20 month cost for pediatric ~~vaccines~~ recommended immunizations based on the
21 total number of pediatric covered lives reported by health insurers and the per-

1 member per-month cost for adult ~~vaccines~~ recommended immunizations based
2 on the total number of adult covered lives reported by health insurers.

3 (h) If ~~federal~~ purchase requirements do not further the goal of ensuring
4 universal access to ~~vaccines~~ recommended immunizations for all, the
5 Commissioner may, following consultation with the Immunization Funding
6 Advisory Committee, discontinue the program with six months' advance
7 notice to all health care professionals and to all health insurers with Vermont
8 covered lives.

12 § 1130a. RECOMMENDED IMMUNIZATIONS

13 (a) The Commissioner shall periodically issue recommendations regarding:

14 (1) which immunizations children and adults are recommended to
15 receive;

16 (2) the age at which each immunization is recommended to be given;

17 (3) the number of immunization doses that are recommended to be
18 administered;

19 (4) the recommended amount of time between doses of an
20 immunization; and

1 (5) any other recommendations regarding immunizations necessary to
2 promote the maintenance of public health and disease prevention in the State.

3 (b) Prior to issuing recommendations under subsection (a) of this section,
4 the Commissioner shall:

5 (1) consult with the Vermont Immunization Advisory Council,
6 established under section 1131 of this title; and

7 (2) consider recommendations for immunizations issued by the Centers
8 for Disease Control and Prevention’s Advisory Committee on Immunization
9 Practices (ACIP), the American Academy of Pediatrics (AAP), the American
10 Academy of Family Physicians (AAFP), the American College of
11 Obstetricians and Gynecologists (ACOG), the American College of Physicians
12 (ACP), and any other organizations the Commissioner may deem necessary.

13 (c) A health care professional who prescribes, dispenses, or administers an
14 immunization in accordance with the recommendations issued pursuant to
15 subsection (a) of this section shall be immune from civil and administrative
16 liability for immunization-caused adverse events, unless the health care
17 professional’s actions regarding prescribing, dispensing, or administering an
18 immunization constituted gross negligence, recklessness, or intentional
19 misconduct.

20 (d) The Commissioner may issue a standing order authorizing health care
21 professionals, including pharmacists, to prescribe, dispense, or administer

1 recommended immunizations, or any combination thereof, to the extent that
2 prescribing, dispensing, or administering recommended immunizations is
3 within the scope of the health care professional's practice.

4 (e)(1) The Department shall prominently display information pertaining to
5 recommended immunizations and other relevant information on its website,
6 including how to access recommended immunizations.

7 (2) Any documents produced by the Department about the
8 recommended immunizations shall include a disclosure if the recommended
9 immunizations differ from the recommendations of the Vermont Immunization
10 Advisory Council.

11 (f) As used in this section, "health care professional" and "recommended
12 immunization" have the same meanings as in section 1130 of this title.
