3	(a)(1) The Departments of Health and of Mental Health's existing plan to
4	expand services and programming for persons who are incapacitated pursuant
5	to 18 V.S.A. § 4810 shall prioritize Chittenden County.
6	(2) On or before February 15, 2026, the Departments of Health and of
7	Mental Health shall jointly provide a presentation to the House Committees on
8	Health Care and on Human Services and to the Senate Committee on Health
