19	sheriff paid by the State pursuant to 24 V.S.A. § 290(b), including permanent
20	part-time employees, and an individual whose work has ceased as a

1	consequence of, or in connection with, any current labor dispute or because of
2	any unfair labor practice, but excluding an individual:
3	(A) exempt or excluded from the State classified service under the
4	provisions of section 311 of this title, except that the State Police in the
5	Department of Public Safety; employees of the Defender General, excluding
6	attorneys employed directly by the Defender General and attorneys contracted
7	to provide legal services; deputy State's Attorneys; <u>Assistant Attorneys</u>
8	General; employees of State's Attorneys' offices; and full-time deputy sheriffs
9	paid by the State pursuant to 24 V.S.A. § 290(b) are included within the
10	meaning of "State employee";
