5 Subject: Education; special education; DCF; parent child center network  
6 Statement of purpose of bill as introduced: This bill proposes to appropriate  
7 \$250,000.00 to the Agency of Human Services to establish a two-year pilot  
8 program that awards grants to develop special education family advocacy pilot  
9 programs.

10 An act relating to establishing a special education family advocacy pilot  
11 program

12 It is hereby enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Vermont:

13 Sec. 1. SPECIAL EDUCATION FAMILY ADVOCACY PILOT PROGRAM

14 (a) In fiscal year 2027, \$250,000.00 is appropriated from the General Fund  
15 to the Agency of Human Services to establish a two-year pilot program that  
16 awards grants to develop special education family advocacy pilot programs.

17 The pilot programs shall aim to:

18 (1) ensure that families of kindergarten through grade 12 students have  
19 access to knowledgeable, neutral advocates to guide them through the

1       individualized education program (IEP) process, including access to in-person  
2       support during IEP meetings;

3           (2) strengthen collaboration between schools and parents; and  
4           (3) help prevent costly disputes and due process hearings by addressing  
5       issues early.

6       (b) The Agency shall seek applications from school districts, parent child  
7       centers, and other interested nonprofit organizations. Successful applicants  
8       shall submit an application to the Agency describing how the applicant, if  
9       awarded a grant, shall:

10           (1) train advocates to provide direct support for parents of children with  
11       disabilities in grades kindergarten through 12 through the IEP process;  
12           (2) provide trainings for parents to prepare and empower them to  
13       advocate on their own during the IEP process; and  
14           (3) collaborate with school districts with the goal of supporting all  
15       involved parties to work together in the best interests of students.

16       (c) On or before November 15, 2027, the Agency shall submit a written  
17       report to the House Committees on Education and on Human Services and to  
18       the Senate Committees on Education and on Health and Welfare evaluating the  
19       pilot program created pursuant to this section and any recommended future  
20       actions. In drafting the report required pursuant to this subsection, the Agency  
21       shall seek the input of the Agency of Education in evaluating the need for and

1       effectiveness of the pilot program and include the Agency of Education's  
2       response as part of the report.

3       Sec. 2. EFFECTIVE DATE

4       This act shall take effect on July 1, 2026.
