3	Subject: Agriculture; fertilizer; beneficial substances; miscellaneous subjects
4	Statement of purpose of bill as introduced: This bill proposes to amend the
5	State statutes on the use of plan amendments, plant biostimulants, and soil
6	amendments to be consistent with the uniform standards for regulation of
7	beneficial substances. The bill would define "beneficial substances" to mean
8	any substance or compound, other than primary, secondary, and micro plant
9	nutrients (fertilizers), and excluding pesticides, that can be demonstrated by
10	scientific research to be beneficial to one or more species of plants, soil, or
11	media.
12	An act relating to miscellaneous agricultural subjects
13	It is hereby enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Vermont:
14	Sec. 1. 6 V.S.A. chapter 28 is amended to read:
15	CHAPTER 28. FERTILIZER AND, LIME, AND BENEFICIAL
16	<u>SUBSTANCES</u>
17	§ 361. TITLE
18	This chapter shall be known as the "Fertilizer, Lime, Plant Amendment,
19	Plant Biostimulant, and Soil Amendment and Beneficial Substances Law."

1	§ 362. ENFORCING OFFICIAL
2	This chapter shall be administered by the Secretary of Agriculture, Food
3	and Markets or designee, hereafter referred to as the Secretary.
4	§ 363. DEFINITIONS
5	As used in this chapter:
6	(1) "Agricultural lime" or "agricultural liming material" or "lime"
7	means one or more of the following:
8	(A) All products with calcium and magnesium compounds that are
9	capable of neutralizing soil acidity and that are intended, sold, or offered for
10	sale for agricultural or plant propagation purposes.
11	(B) Limestone consisting essentially of calcium carbonate or a
12	combination of calcium carbonate with magnesium carbonate capable of
13	neutralizing soil acidity.
14	(C) Industrial waste or industrial by-products that contain calcium;
15	calcium and magnesium; or calcium, magnesium, and potassium in forms that
16	are capable of neutralizing soil acidity and that are intended, sold, or offered
17	for sale for agricultural purposes. For the purposes of this chapter, the terms
18	"agricultural lime," "lime," and "agricultural liming material" shall have the
19	same meaning.
20	(2) "Beneficial substance" means any substance or compound, other
21	than primary, secondary, and micro plant nutrients (fertilizers), and excluding

1	pesticides, that can be demonstrated by scientific research to be beneficial to
2	one or more species of plants, soil, or media. Beneficial substances include
3	plant amendments, plant biostimulants, plant inoculants, soil amendments, soil
4	inoculants, and other chemical or biological substances beneficial to plants or
5	their growing environment.
6	(3) "Brand" means a term, design, or trademark used in connection with
7	one or more grades or formulas of fertilizer, plant amendment, plant
8	biostimulant, soil amendment beneficial substance, or lime.
9	(3)(4) "Distribute" means to import, consign, manufacture, produce,
10	compound, mix, blend, offer for sale, sell, barter, or supply a fertilizer, a plant
11	amendment, a plant biostimulant, a soil amendment a beneficial substance, or
12	lime in this State through any means, including sales outlets, catalogues, the
13	telephone, the internet, or any electronic means.
14	(4)(5) "Distributor" means any person who distributes fertilizer, plant
15	amendment, plant biostimulant, soil amendments beneficial substance, or lime.
16	(5)(6) "Exceptional quality biosolid" means a product derived in whole
17	or in part from domestic wastes that have been subjected to and meet the
18	requirements of the following:
19	(A) a pathogen reduction process established in 40 C.F.R.
20	§ 503.32(a)(3), (4), (7), or (8);

1	(B) one of the vector attraction reduction standards established in 40
2	C.F.R. § 503.33;
3	(C) the contaminant concentration limits in Vermont Solid Waste
4	Rules § 6-1303(a)(1); and
5	(D) if derived from a composting process, Vermont Solid Waste
6	Rules § 6-1303(a)(5).
7	(6)(7) "Fertilizer" means any substance containing one or more
8	recognized plant nutrients that is used for its plant nutrient content and that is
9	designed for use or claimed to have value in promoting plant growth or health,
10	except unprocessed animal or vegetable manures and other products exempted
11	by the Secretary.
12	(A) A fertilizer material is a substance that either:
13	(i) contains important quantities of at least one of the primary
14	plant nutrients: nitrogen, phosphorus, or potassium;
15	(ii) has 85 percent or more of its plant nutrient content present in
16	the form of a single chemical compound; or
16 17	the form of a single chemical compound; or (iii) is derived from a plant or chemical residue or by-product or
17	(iii) is derived from a plant or chemical residue or by-product or

1	(B) A mixed fertilizer is a fertilizer containing any combination or
2	mixture of fertilizer materials.
3	(C) A specialty fertilizer is a fertilizer distributed for nonfarm use.
4	(D) A bulk fertilizer is a fertilizer distributed in a nonpackaged form.
5	(7)(8) "Formulation" means a material or mixture of materials prepared
6	according to a particular formula.
7	(8)(9) "Grade" means the percentage of total nitrogen, available
8	phosphorus or phosphoric acid, and soluble potassium or potash stated in
9	whole numbers in the same terms, order, or percentages as in the guaranteed
10	analysis. Specialty fertilizers and fertilizer materials may be guaranteed in
11	fractional terms. Any grade expressed in fractional terms that is not preceded
12	by a whole number shall be preceded by zero.
13	(9)(10) "Guaranteed analysis" means:
14	(A) in reference to fertilizer, the minimum percentages of plant
15	nutrients claimed by the manufacturer or producer of the product in the
16	following order and form: nitrogen, phosphorus, and potash; and
17	(B) in reference to agricultural lime or agricultural liming material,
18	the minimum percentages of calcium oxide and magnesium oxide or calcium
19	carbonate and the calcium carbonate equivalent, or both, as claimed by the
20	manufacturer or producer of the product.

1	(10)(11) "Label" means the display of all written, printed, or graphic
2	matter upon the immediate container or a statement accompanying a fertilizer,
3	plant amendment, plant biostimulant, soil amendment beneficial substance, or
4	lime.
5	(11)(12) "Labeling" means all written, printed, or graphic material upon
6	or accompanying any fertilizer, plant amendment, plant biostimulant, soil
7	amendment beneficial substance, or lime, including advertisements, brochures,
8	posters, and television and radio announcements used in promoting the sale of
9	the fertilizer, plant amendment, plant biostimulant, soil amendment beneficial
10	substance, or lime.
11	(12)(13) "Official sample" means any sample of fertilizer, plant
12	amendment, plant biostimulant, soil amendment beneficial substance, or lime
13	taken by the Secretary.
14	(13)(14) "Plant amendment" means any substance applied to plants or
15	seeds that is intended to improve growth, yield, product quality, reproduction,
16	flavor, or other favorable characteristics of plants, except for fertilizer, soil
17	amendments, agricultural liming materials, animal and vegetable manures,
18	pesticides, plant regulators, and other materials exempted by rule adopted
19	under this chapter.
20	(14)(15) "Plant biostimulant" means a substance or, microorganism, or
21	mixtures thereof that, when applied to seeds, plants, or the rhizosphere,

1	stimulates soil, or other growth media act to support a plant's natural nutrition
2	processes to enhance or benefit nutrient uptake, nutrient efficiency, tolerance
3	to abiotic stress, or crop quality and yield, except for fertilizers, soil
4	amendments, plant amendments, or pesticides independently of the
5	biostimulant's nutrient content. The plant biostimulant thereby improves
6	nutrient availability, uptake, or use efficiency, tolerance to abiotic stress, and
7	consequent growth development, quality, or yield. The Secretary may modify
8	the definition of "plant biostimulant" by rule or procedure in order to maintain
9	consistency with U.S. Department of Agriculture requirements.
10	(16) "Plant inoculant" means a product consisting of microorganisms to
11	be applied to the plant or soil for the purpose of enhancing the availability or
12	uptake of plant nutrients through the root system.
13	(15)(17) "Percent" or "percentage" means the percentage by weight.
14	(16)(18) "Primary nutrient" includes nitrogen, available phosphoric acid
15	or phosphorus, and soluble potash or potassium.
16	(17)(19) "Product" means the name of the fertilizer, plant amendment,
17	plant biostimulant, soil amendment beneficial substance, or lime that identifies
18	it as to kind, class, or specific use.
19	(18)(20) "Registrant" means the person who registers a fertilizer, plant
20	amendment, plant biostimulant, soil amendment beneficial substance, or lime
21	under the provisions of this chapter.

1	(19)(21) "Soil amendment" means a substance or mixture of substance
2	that is intended to improve the physical, chemical, biochemical, biological, or
3	other characteristics of the soil or a distinct form of horticultural growing
4	media used in lieu of soil. "Soil amendment" does not mean fertilizers,
5	agricultural liming materials, unprocessed animal manures, unprocessed
6	vegetable manures, pesticides, plant biostimulants, and other materials
7	exempted by rule. A compost product from a facility under the jurisdiction of
8	the Agency of Natural Resources' Solid Waste Management Rules or
9	exceptional quality biosolids shall not be regulated as a soil amendment under
10	this chapter, unless marketed and distributed for the use in the production of an
11	agricultural commodity.
12	(22) "Soil inoculant" means a microbial product that is applied to
13	colonize the soil to benefit the soil chemistry, biology, or structure.
14	(20)(23) "Ton" means a net weight of 2,000 pounds avoirdupois.
15	(21)(24) "Use" includes all purposes for which a fertilizer, plant
16	amendment, plant biostimulant, soil amendment beneficial substance, or lime
17	is applied.
18	(22)(25) "Weight" means the weight of undried material as offered for
19	sale.

# 1 § 364. REGISTRATION

2	(a) Each brand or grade or formula of fertilizer, plant amendment, plant
3	biostimulant, or soil amendment beneficial substance shall be registered in the
4	name of the person whose name appears upon the label before being
5	distributed in this State. The application for registration shall be submitted to
6	the Secretary on a form furnished by the Agency of Agriculture, Food and
7	Markets and shall be accompanied by a fee of \$85.00 per grade or formulation
8	registered. Upon approval by the Secretary, a copy of the registration shall be
9	furnished to the applicant. All registrations expire on December 31 of each
10	year. The application shall include the following information:
11	(1) the brand and grade or formulation;
12	(2) the guaranteed analysis if applicable; and
13	(3) the name and address of the registrant.
14	(b) A distributor shall not be required to register any fertilizer, plant
15	amendment, plant biostimulant, or soil amendment or beneficial substance that
16	is already registered under this chapter by another person, provided there is no
17	change in the label for the fertilizer <del>, plant amendment, plant biostimulant, or</del>
18	soil amendment or beneficial substance.
19	(c) Each beneficial substance brand shall refer to a specific formulation.
20	Different brands may refer to the same specific formulation. Products for
21	which formulations change, such as changes in the "Contains Beneficial

1	Substances" analysis, statement of composition, or anything that implies a
2	different product, must obtain a new registration with a brand that
3	distinguishes it from the previous formulation.
4	(d) A distributor shall not be required to register each grade of fertilizer
5	formulated or each formulation of soil amendment according to specifications
6	that are furnished by a consumer prior to mixing but shall be required to label
7	the fertilizer or soil amendment as provided in subsection 365(b) of this title.
8	(d)(e) The Secretary may request additional proof of testing of products
9	prior to registration for guaranteed analyses or adulterants.
10	(e)(f) Each separately identified agricultural lime product shall be
11	registered before being distributed in this State. Registration shall be
12	performed in the same manner as fertilizer registration except that each
13	application shall be accompanied by a fee of \$50.00 per product.
14	(f)(g) The registration and tonnage fees, along with any deficiency
15	penalties collected pursuant to sections 331 and 372 of this title, shall be
16	deposited in a special fund. Funds deposited in this fund shall be restricted to
17	implementing and administering the provisions of this title and any other
18	provisions of law relating to feeds and seeds.

# 1 § 365. LABELS

2	(a)(1) Any fertilizer or agricultural lime distributed in this State in
3	containers shall have placed on or affixed to the container a label setting forth
4	in clearly legible and conspicuous form the following information:
5	(A) net weight;
6	(B) brand and grade, provided that grade shall not be required when
7	no primary nutrients are claimed;
8	(C) guaranteed analysis; and
9	(D) name and address of the registrant.
10	(2) For bulk shipments, this information in written or printed form shall
11	accompany delivery and be supplied to the purchaser at the time of delivery.
12	(b) A fertilizer or lime formulated according to specifications furnished by
13	a consumer prior to mixing shall be labeled to show the net weight, the
14	guaranteed analysis or name, analysis and weight of each ingredient used in the
15	mixture, and the name and address of the distributor and purchaser.
16	(c) If the Secretary finds that a requirement for expressing calcium and
17	magnesium in elemental form would not impose an economic hardship on
18	distributors and users of agricultural liming materials by reason of conflicting
19	label requirements among states, the Secretary may require by rule that the
20	minimum percent of calcium oxide and magnesium oxide or calcium carbonate
21	and magnesium carbonate, or both, shall be expressed in the following terms:

1	Total Calcium (Ca) percent
2	Total Magnesium (Mg) percent
3	(d)(1) Any plant amendment, plant biostimulant, or soil amendment
4	beneficial substance distributed in this State in containers shall have placed on
5	or affixed to the container a label setting forth in clearly legible and
6	conspicuous form the following information:
7	(A) net weight or volume;
8	(B) brand name;
9	(C) purpose <u>statement identifying the purpose</u> of <u>the</u> product;
10	(D) directions for application <u>or use;</u>
11	(E) guaranteed analysis; and
12	(F) name and address of the registrant; and
13	(F) a statement of composition showing the amount of each
14	ingredient, which is the agent in a product primarily responsible for the
15	intended effects using the following format:
16	CONTAINS BENEFICIAL SUBSTANCE(S)
17	Name of beneficial substance % (or acceptable
18	units)
19	Genus and species of microorganism % viable CFU/cm3, /ml,
20	/g, or other acceptable units

1	(Identify and list all beneficial substances. Substances shall include
2	ingredient source, if applicable. Ex. "humic acid from leonardite or saponin
3	from Yucca schidigera").
4	(2) For products that claim microorganisms, labels shall also include:
5	(A) the expiration date for use; and
6	(B) storage conditions.
7	(2)(3) For bulk shipments of fertilizer, plant amendment, plant
8	biostimulant, soil amendment beneficial substances, or lime, the information
9	required under this subsection shall accompany delivery in written or printed
10	form and shall be supplied to the purchaser at the time of delivery.
11	(4) Efficacy data may be required to support beneficial substance
12	ingredient claims if the ingredient is not presently defined by the Association
13	of American Plant Food Control Officials' Official Publication for the
14	particular claim.
15	(3)(5) Under a rule adopted under this subsection, an affected person
16	shall be given a reasonable time to come into compliance.
17	§ 366. TONNAGE FEES
18	(a) A person distributing fertilizer to a nonregistrant consumer in the State
19	annually shall pay the following fees to the Secretary:
20	(1) a \$150.00 minimum tonnage fee;
21	(2) \$0.50 per ton of agricultural fertilizer distributed; and

1	(3) \$30.00 per ton of nonagricultural fertilizer distributed.
2	(b) Persons distributing fertilizer shall report annually on or before January
3	15 for the previous year ending December 31 to the Secretary revealing the
4	amounts of each grade of fertilizer and the form in which the fertilizer was
5	distributed within this State. Each report shall be accompanied with payment
6	and written permission allowing the Secretary to examine the person's books
7	for the purpose of verifying tonnage reports.
8	(c) No information concerning tonnage sales furnished to the Secretary
9	under this section shall be disclosed in such a way as to divulge the details of
10	the business operation to any person unless it is necessary for the enforcement
11	of the provisions of this chapter.
12	(d) Persons distributing a plant amendment, plant biostimulant, or soil
13	amendment beneficial substance in the State shall report annually on or before
14	January 15 for the previous year ending December 31 to the Secretary
15	revealing the amounts of each formulation of plant amendment, plant
16	biostimulant, or soil amendment beneficial substance and the form in which
17	the plant amendment, plant biostimulant, or soil amendment beneficial
18	substance was distributed within this State. Each report shall include a written
19	authorization allowing the Secretary to examine the person's books for the
20	purpose of verifying tonnage reports. Plant amendments, plant biostimulants,
21	and soil amendments are A beneficial substance is exempt from tonnage fees.

1	(e) Agricultural limes, including agricultural lime mixed with wood ash,
2	are exempt from the tonnage fees required in this section.
3	(f) Lime and wood ash mixtures may be registered as agricultural liming
4	materials and guaranteed for potassium or potash, provided that the wood ash
5	totals less than 50 percent of the mixture.
6	(g)(1) All fees collected under subdivisions (a)(1) and (2) of this section
7	shall be deposited in the special fund created by subsection 364(f) of this title
8	and used in accordance with its provisions.
9	(2) All fees collected under subdivision $(a)(3)$ of this section shall be
10	deposited in the Agricultural Water Quality Special Fund created under section
11	4803 of this title.

3	(2) To inspect blending plants, warehouses, establishments, vehicles,
4	equipment, finished or unfinished materials, containers, labeling, and records
5	relating to distribution, storage, or use.
6	(3) To sample and analyze any fertilizer, plant amendment, plant
7	biostimulant, soil amendment beneficial substance, or lime. The methods of
8	sampling and analysis shall be those adopted by the Association of Official
9	Analytical Chemists. In cases not covered by this method or in cases where
10	methods are available in which improved applicability has been demonstrated,
11	the Secretary may authorize and adopt methods that reflect sound analytical
12	procedures.
13	(4) To develop any reasonable means necessary to monitor and adopt
14	rules for the use of fertilizers, plant amendments, plant biostimulants, soil
15	amendments beneficial substances, and lime on Vermont soils where
16	monitoring indicates environmental or health problems. In addition, the
17	Secretary may develop and adopt rules for the proper storage of fertilizers,
18	plant amendments, plant biostimulants, soil amendments beneficial substances,
19	and lime held for distribution or sale.

#### 1 § 368. MISBRANDING 2 (a) No person shall distribute a misbranded fertilizer, plant amendment, 3 plant biostimulant, soil amendment beneficial substance, or agricultural lime. 4 A fertilizer, plant amendment, plant biostimulant, or soil amendment beneficial 5 substance shall be deemed to be misbranded if the Secretary determines one or 6 more of the following: 7 (1) The labeling is false or misleading in any particular. 8 (2) It is distributed under the name of another fertilizer product, plant 9 amendment, plant biostimulant, or soil amendment beneficial substance. 10 (3) It contains unsubstantiated claims. 11 (4) It is not labeled as required in section 365 of this title and in 12 accordance with rules adopted under this chapter. 13 (5) It is labeled, or represented, to contain a plant nutrient that does not 14 conform to the standard of identity established by rule. In adopting rules under 15 this chapter, the Secretary shall give consideration to consider definitions 16 recommended by the Association of American Plant Food Control Officials. 17 (b) An agricultural lime shall be deemed to be misbranded if: 18 (1) its labeling is false or misleading in any particular; or 19 (2) it is not labeled as required by section 365 of this title and in 20 accordance with rules adopted under this chapter.

# 1 § 369. ADULTERATION

2	No person shall distribute an adulterated lime, plant amendment, plant
3	biostimulant, soil amendment beneficial substance, or fertilizer product. A
4	fertilizer, <del>plant amendment, plant biostimulant, soil amendment</del> beneficial
5	substance, or lime shall be deemed to be adulterated if:
6	(1) it contains any deleterious or harmful ingredient in an amount
7	sufficient to render it injurious to beneficial plant life, animals, humans,
8	aquatic life, soil, or water when applied in accordance with directions for use
9	on the label, or if uses of the product may result in contamination or
10	condemnation of a raw agricultural commodity by use, or if adequate warning
11	statements or directions for use that may be necessary to protect plant life.
12	animals, humans, aquatic life, soil, or water are not shown on the label;
13	(2) its composition falls below or differs from that which it is purported
14	to possess by its labeling;
15	(3) it contains crop seed or weed seed; or
16	(4) it contains heavy metals, radioactive substances, or synthetic
17	organics in amounts sufficient to render it injurious to livestock or human
18	health when applied in accordance with directions for use on the label, or if
19	adequate warning statements or directions for use that may be necessary to
20	protect livestock or human health are not shown on the label.

1	§ 370. PUBLICATION; CONSUMER INFORMATION REGARDING USE
2	ON NONAGRICULTURAL TURF OF FERTILIZER <del>, PLANT</del>
3	AMENDMENTS, PLANT BIOSTIMULANTS, AND SOIL
4	AMENDMENTS BENEFICIAL SUBSTANCES
5	(a) The Secretary shall publish on an annual basis:
6	(1) information concerning the distribution of fertilizers, <del>plant</del>
7	amendments, plant biostimulants, soil amendments or beneficial substances,
8	and limes; and
9	(2) results of analyses based on official samples of fertilizers, plant
10	amendments, plant biostimulants, soil amendments beneficial substances, and
11	lime distributed within the State as compared with guaranteed analyses
12	required pursuant to the terms of this chapter.
13	(b)(1) The Secretary, in consultation with the University of Vermont
14	Extension, fertilizer industry representatives, lake groups, and other interested
15	or affected parties, shall produce information for distribution to the general
16	public with respect to the following:
17	(A) problems faced by the waters of the State because of discharges
18	of phosphorus;
19	(B) an explanation of the extent to which phosphorus exists naturally
20	in the soil;

1	(C) voluntary best management practices for the use of fertilizers
2	containing phosphorus on nonagricultural turf; and
3	(D) best management practices for residential sources of phosphorus.
4	(2) The Secretary shall develop the information required under this
5	subsection and make it available to the general public in the manner deemed
6	most effective, which may include:
7	(A) conspicuous posting at the point of retail sale of fertilizer
8	containing phosphorus, according to recommendations for how that
9	conspicuous posting may best take place;
10	(B) public service announcements by means of electronic media; or
11	(C) other methods deemed by the Secretary to be likely to be
12	effective.
13	§ 371. RULES
14	The Secretary is authorized to adopt rules pursuant to 3 V.S.A. chapter 25 as
15	may be necessary to implement the intent of this chapter and to enforce those
16	rules.
17	* * *
18	§ 374. SHORT WEIGHT
19	(a) If any fertilizer, plant amendment, plant biostimulant, soil amendment
20	beneficial substance, or agricultural liming material is found to be short in net
21	weight, the registrant of the fertilizer, plant amendment, plant biostimulant,

1	soil amendment beneficial substance, or lime shall pay a penalty of three times
2	the value of the actual shortage to the affected party.
3	(b) Each registrant shall be offered an opportunity for a hearing before the
4	Secretary. Penalty payments shall be made within 30 days after notice of the
5	Secretary's decision to assess a penalty. Proof of payment to the consumer
6	shall be promptly forwarded to the Secretary by the registrant.
7	(c) If the consumer cannot be found, the amount of the penalty payments
8	shall be paid to the Secretary who shall deposit the payment into the revolving
9	account established by subsection 364(f) of this title.
10	(d) This section is not an exclusive cause of action, and persons affected
11	may utilize any other right of action available under law.

2	in violation of any of the provisions of this chapter or any of the rules under
3	this chapter, the Secretary may issue and enforce a written or printed
4	"withdrawal from distribution" order, warning the distributor not to dispose of
5	the lot of fertilizer, plant amendment, plant biostimulant, soil amendment
6	beneficial substance, or lime in any manner until written permission is given
7	by the Secretary or the court. The Secretary shall release the lot of fertilizer,
8	plant amendment, plant biostimulant, soil amendment beneficial substance, or
9	lime withdrawn when this chapter and rules have been complied with. If
10	compliance is not obtained within 30 days, the Secretary may begin, or upon
11	request of the distributor or registrant shall begin, proceedings for
12	condemnation.
13	(b) Condemnation and confiscation. Any lot of fertilizer, plant
14	amendment, plant biostimulant, soil amendment beneficial substance, or lime
15	not in compliance with this chapter and rules shall be subject to seizure on
16	complaint of the Secretary to a court of competent jurisdiction in the area in
17	which the fertilizer, plant amendment, plant biostimulant, soil amendment
18	beneficial substance, or lime is located. In the event the court finds the
19	fertilizer, <del>plant amendment, plant biostimulant, soil amendment</del> beneficial
20	substance, or lime to be in violation of this chapter and orders the

4	Consistent with chapter 1 of this title, the Secretary may assess an

7	(1) distributed a specialty fertilizer, plant amendment, plant
8	biostimulant, soil amendment beneficial substance, or lime without first
9	obtaining the appropriate product registration;

11	amendment beneficial substance, or lime without appropriate and accurate
12	labeling, including when a beneficial substance label does not reflects its
