

VVBGA Membership By State




2023 VVBGA member survey

Ornamentals 117 farms	112 acres 1 acre average	65% of farms
Berries 116 farms	271 acres 2.3 acres average	64% of farms

sales of vegetables and berries reported in survey = \$42 million (n=168 farms, less than half VVBGA membership)




Top concerns of growers: farm labor availability and retention, climate change and extreme weather




