
We are already on the road

- \$1m for VT Foodbank network of food shelves & more
- Base funding for VT 211
- Emergency Planning statute includes food considerations
- Funding for Land Access & Opportunity Board community programs



We are already on the road

- Farm Security Fund advances
- Vermonters Feeding Vermonters grant program established and partially funded
- Land Access & Opportunity Board funded
- Crop Cash (Plus) and Farm Share partially funded



We are already on the road

- Tax Credits expanded
- Federal Shutdown response for Vermonters:
 - Cover SNAP payments gap
 - State funds to VT Foodbank's network
- SNAP discretionary months
- Family Child Care Home meal program sponsor support
- Universal School Meals
 - 5 years, 1,000 days, 14 million meals





2026 Policy Requests

The State of Vermont can make policy choices to ensure food security for everyone who lives here.



Maximize Federal Funding with Strategic State Investments

SNAP Administrative Match:

Appropriate in FY2027 an additional \$6.3 million to the Department for Children and Families - Economic Services Division to ensure continued State administration of the SNAP program (3SquaresVT) in response to the changed federal match requirement.





Maximize Federal Funding with Strategic State Investments

SNAP Administrative Match:

- Investing an additional \$6.3 million now (and \$8.4 million in future fiscal years) will allow Vermont to continue leveraging **over \$150 million in federal dollars** that are spent directly in our food system during the same 12-month period.
- Appropriating \$6.3 million in FY27 is essential to maximizing and leveraging federal funding, **maintaining a low payment error rate**, and ensuring effective delivery of 3SquaresVT.





Maximize Federal Funding with Strategic State Investments

Benefit Assisters

Appropriate \$5.75 million in FY2027 to service-providing organizations to expand capacity for Benefit Assisters to keep eligible people on federal SNAP and Medicaid benefit programs.





Maximize Federal Funding with Strategic State Investments

CACFP

Appropriate in FY2027 \$182,000 to the Agency of Education - Child Nutrition Programs for the Sponsor Organizations of the Child and Adult Care Food Program (CACFP) as an incentive to participate as a sponsor of the CACFP for Family Child Care Home providers.





Maximize Federal Funding with Strategic State Investments

CACFP

- The CACFP is the federal child nutrition program that early Family Child Care Home providers can participate in to receive cash reimbursement for eligible meals and snacks served
- A Family Child Care Home can only participate in the CACFP under an agreement with an eligible sponsoring organization
- The appropriation will cover the administrative funding gap for sponsoring organizations





Fund the Land Access & Opportunity Board (LAOB)

Fund the Land Access and Opportunity Board in FY2027 for their operational costs and program funding

- Operational: \$1,784,809 total base appropriation
- Programs: \$1,432,925 one-time appropriation
- Budget Adjustment Act:
 - \$1M for LAOB to reinstate FY26 grant programs, including Community Resilience Hub Grants



Fund the Land Access & Opportunity Board (LAOB)

“There is created the Vermont Land Access and Opportunity Board to promote improvements in access to woodlands, farmland, and land and home ownership for Vermonters from historically marginalized or disadvantaged communities who continue to face barriers to land and home ownership.”

- LAOB has Advisory Powers → SOV and affiliated institutions
- LAOB has Grant Making Powers →marginalized communities & individuals



Support Local Food Security, Vermont Farms, and Food Producers

Vermonters Feeding Vermonters

Budget Adjustment Act

- Fully fund the Vermonters Feeding Vermonters local food purchase program in FY2026 with \$1.5 million

FY2027

- \$2 million for Vermonters Feeding Vermonters grant program at VAAFM





Support Local Food Security, Vermont Farms, and Food Producers

Vermont Foodbank:

- Support Vermont Foodbank network food shelves and meal sites (\$2 million)
- Support Ready Response for food access in emergencies (\$1 million)

Support Local Food Security, Vermont Farms, and Food Producers

Appropriate \$500,000 in FY2027 to NOFA Vermont to support the Crop Cash, Crop Cash Plus, and Farm Share programs.





Support Local Food Security, Vermont Farms, and Food Producers

- Enact S.60, the Farm & Forestry Operations Security Special Fund bill.
- Appropriate \$20 million in FY2027 for the Farm & Forestry Operations Security Special Fund.





Support Local Food Security, Vermont Farms, and Food Producers

Increase base funding in FY2027 for the Working Lands Enterprise Fund from \$1 million to \$1.5 million. Supplement the Working Lands Enterprise Fund with an additional \$3.5 million in one-time funding in FY2027 to address backlog and rising demand.
