The Vermont Foodbank (VF) is seeking \$5 million total in FY26 from the State of Vermont:

- \$1.75 million in base funding for Responsive Readiness
- \$3.25 million for food purchase and distribution

State funding is required to address the sustained, increased need for access to food in communities throughout Vermont and to support our 215+ network of partner food shelves and meal sites who are doing this work on main streets across the state.

**Responsive Readiness:** Vermont Foodbank seeks to formalize an agreement with the State with a \$1.75 million base budget appropriation through Vermont Emergency Management. This will ensure that VF warehouses are stocked, our fleet is ready, and that VF and their network are resourced to meet challenges today and ready to help people recover.

**Food Purchase and Distribution:** Vermonters continue to experience food insecurity at a rate that has increased in recent years. We know the State of Vermont can make policy choices that will ensure food security for everyone who lives here. Some of those policy choices will take time to pass and implement. The State can support neighbors with the food they need <u>today</u>, including food from Vermont farms with the Vermonters Feeding Vermonters program. Through this program, the Vermont Foodbank purchases Vermont-grown food directly from farms and distributes it throughout the Vermont Foodbank network of food shelves and meal sites, and program partners like housing sites, hospitals and schools.

"Without the Vermont Foodbank's programs, Feeding the Valley Alliance could not provide food to our neighbors in the Upper White River Valley (Rochester, Hancock, Granville mainly). We depend on monthly distributions from the Veggie Van Go program. This program helps us to provide fresh fruits and vegetables to an average of about 40 families per month. Our numbers fluctuate between 35 families and up to 77 families. These are small rural communities (combined pop. of less than 2500) with many senior citizens and working families. Often they don't qualify for aid but still struggle to meet their needs every month. Our distributions provide, much needed fresh food, a little bit of relief, and a moment to share community and reconnect with neighbors at the distributions. For our delivery folks, we are often able to check in on seniors who may live alone or be otherwise isolated. Please consider the downstream impacts of this funding. It does not stop at the Foodbank - the benefits trickle down to rural communities with limited access to transportation and food purchasing choices."
