In an attempt to anticipate potential reductions to federal funds, the House Committee on Appropriations seeks written and oral testimony from entities across State government on the nature and status of federal funds used to support their fiscal year 2026 budgets.

Specifically, the Committee would like to hear more details about federal funds, including positions supported with federal funds, types of grants received, state match rates, subrecipients (if any), etc.

Please bring a copy of the spreadsheet that will be provided by the Secretary of Administration and any other information that you believe relevant for your testimony.

The goal of this exercise is to get a general overview of how federal funds are deployed within each entity, with a <u>primary focus on how federal funds are used</u> and who or what would be harmed if the funding streams were reduced or <u>eliminated</u>.

During oral testimony, the Committee will likely ask questions such as:

- How much federal funding do you receive?
- Which programs/services/activities are supported with federal funds?
- Which programs/services/activities that are currently supported with federal funds are also supported with State funds?
- Are there programs/services/activities that would continue in a reduced capacity if federal funds were eliminated or reduced?
