Vermont's Budget Process

- The State operating budget is built on an annual basis, appropriating funds for a single fiscal year (July 1 to June 30).
- The budget process begins nine months before the start of the fiscal year it covers.

September to October:

Agency Phase

State agencies prepare budgets based on guidance provided by the Governor. Budget targets are based on the July consensus revenue forecast, Administration priorities, and the State's economic condition.

November to December:

Governor's Phase

The Governor's team meets with agencies to discuss their budgets. The Governor must submit a budget ("the Big Bill") to the General Assembly by the third week of January, takes updated January consensus revenue forecast into account.

January to March:

House Phase

The House Appropriations
Committee (HAC)
considers the budget. HAC
hears from the
Administration, standing
committees and holds
public hearings. The bill
typically passes the House
in March.

February to April:

Senate Phase

The Senate
Appropriations
Committee (SAC) begins
taking testimony and
holding hearings a few
weeks after HAC. SAC
considers the Housepassed bill and typically
passes the Senate bill in
April.

May to June:

Committee of Conference and Submission to Governor

Differences are worked out between House and Senate bills. A final bill is passed by both chambers and sent to the Governor for approval or veto.



Reading the Budget

- Different numbering structure from all other bills
- Different numbering structure from the Budget Adjustment Act
- Same numbering structure year to year (mostly)
- A, B, C, D, and E sections
- Plus some others...



A Sections

- Annual explanatory sections
- Purpose, definitions, and the legend
- Outlines the authority being given to the Administration



Sec. A.108 LEGEND


(a) The bill is organized by functions of government. The sections between B.100 and B.9999 contain appropriations of funds for the upcoming budget year. The sections between E.100 and E.9999 contain language that relates to specific appropriations or government functions, or both. The function areas by section numbers are as follows:

B Sections

- "Numbers sections"
- Base appropriations for the coming fiscal year
- Match the current web report
- Each function area shows where funds are going and where they're coming from – but not in full detail



Other B Sections

- One-time
 appropriations for the coming fiscal year
- One-time federal funds
- Cash fund (Capital Bill)
- Miscellaneous onetimes

C Sections

- Current year adjustments, appropriations, and amendments
- We don't catch everything in the Budget Adjustment Act, even though we try
- The Budget is the next opportunity to make changes to the current fiscal year
- Can address funding shortfalls, move funds, and change time-sensitive policy
- Typically these sections are effective on passage

Sec. C.117 2023 Acts and Resolves No. 64, Sec. 3a, is amended to read:

Sec. 3a. APPROPRIATION; SCHOOL MEALS

The sum of \$29,000,000.00 \$26,400,000.00 is appropriated from the

Education Fund to the Agency of Education for fiscal year 2024 to provide reimbursement for school meals under 16 V.S.A. § 4017.



D Sections

- Transfers, reversions, and reserve allocations for the coming fiscal year
 - D.100 allocation of the property transfer tax
 - D.101 fund transfers
 - D.102 reversions



E Sections

- Everything else, mostly
- Language corresponding to the numbers sections
- There isn't an E section for every B section, but every E section links up with a B section
- Mix of annual language and new language
- Annual language will typically have the same number year to year
- If two or more E sections relate to a particular B section, they'll be numbered as .1, .2, etc.

Sec. E.208 PUBLIC SAFETY; ADMINISTRATION

(a) The Commissioner of Public Safety is authorized to enter into a

performance-based contract with the Essex County Sheriff's Department to

provide law enforcement service activities agreed upon by both the

Commissioner of Public Safety and the Sheriff.

Sec. E.208.1 DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC SAFETY; EMBEDDED

MENTAL HEALTH WORKERS; REPORT

(a) In 2025, the Department of Public Safety shall present the House

Committee on Health Care and the Senate Committees on Health and Welfare

and on Judiciary with measurable outcomes on the results of the Department's

embedded mental health worker program to date, by barrack, and on the

Department's collaboration with the Department of Mental Health to achieve a

coordinated and integrated system of care, including how this program works

with 988, with the statewide Mobile Crisis Response program, and with the

designated and specialized service agencies.

F, G, H, I, J, K, L, M, N, O, P, Q, R, S, T, U, V, W, X, Y, and Z Sections

- Change year to year
- Sometimes aren't in the bill at all
- These are sections that get pulled into the bill
- Act 113:
 - F Sections financial regulation fees
 - G Sections Pay Act
 - H Section effective dates
- The effective dates section is always last and always has its own section letter



Wrapping Up

- A lot of the budget is annual language
- Some of what's in the Governor's recommended budget will get pulled into the Budget Adjustment Act
- Things that are missed in the Budget Adjustment Act will get pulled into the budget
- A Sections explain the bill
- B Sections appropriate
- C Sections affect the current fiscal year
- D Sections move money around
- E Sections contain language relating to corresponding B Sections
- Other sections vary year to year and come from other bills
