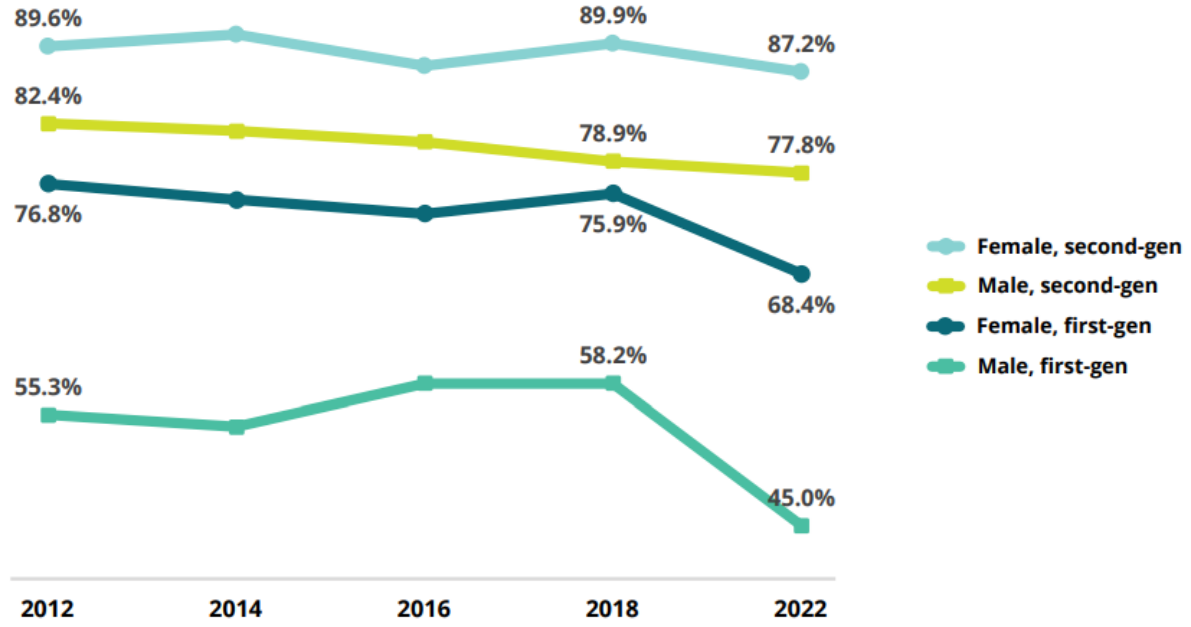

Figure 4. Aspiration rate by gender and parents' educational attainment



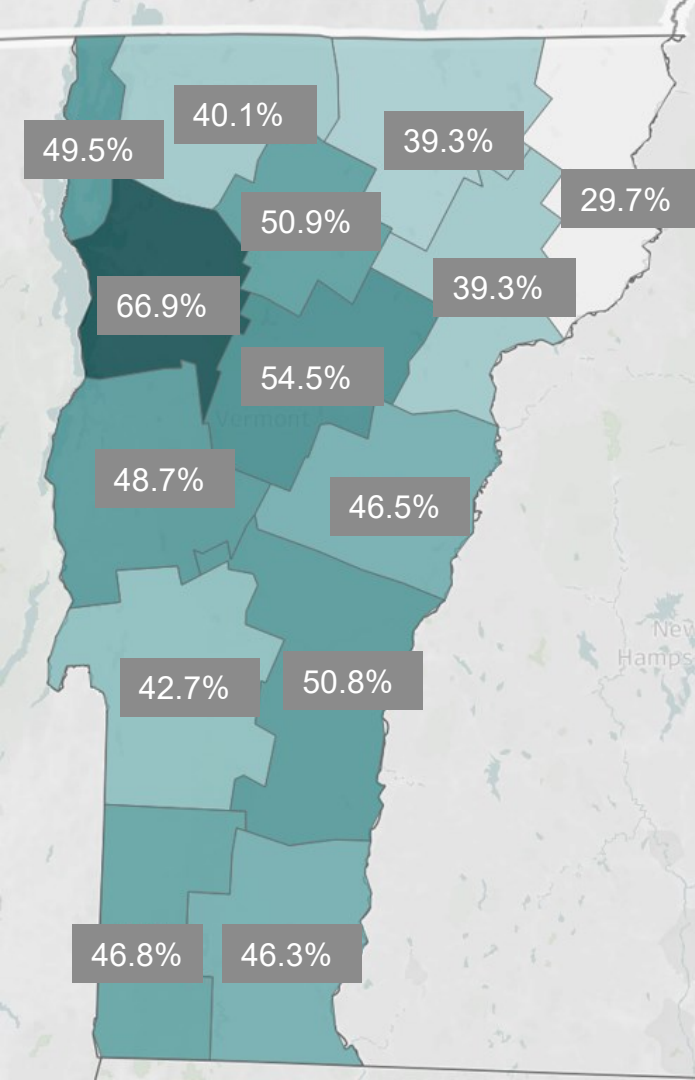

County Attainment

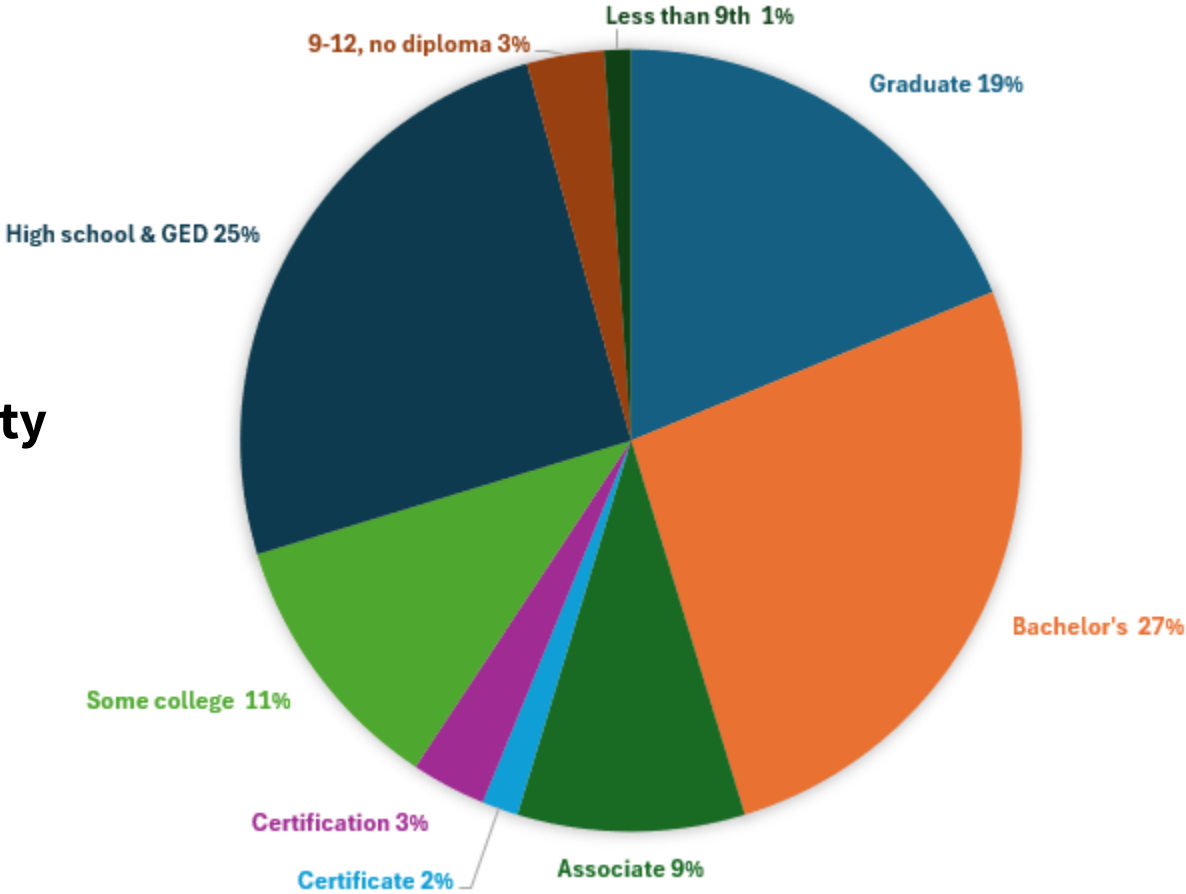


The median attainment rate of working age Vermonters who live outside of Chittenden County is 46.5%.

Major growth opportunity for non-degree options

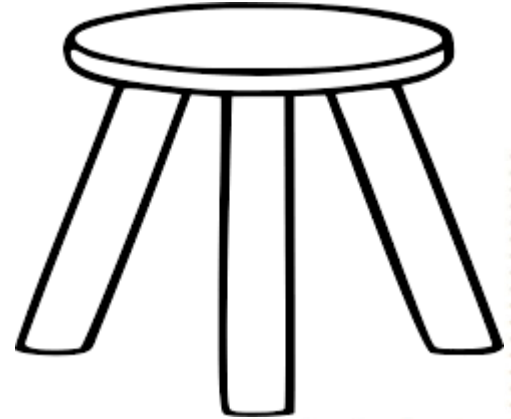

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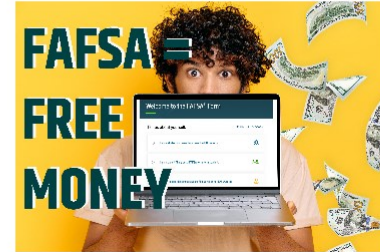

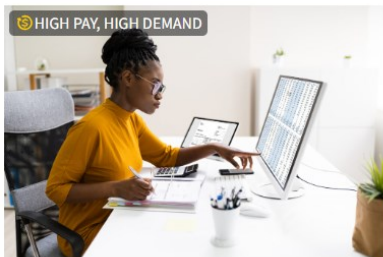

94%

Individuals

Access to clear and accurate program information empowers students and workers to find the credential that works best for their education and career goals.



Employers

Increased knowledge of the credential options leads to new partnerships with education and training providers, and more informed hiring decisions.

Comprehensive program and credential information helps inform workforce development and education policy decisions.



Education and Training Providers

New marketing opportunities for regional and national exposure to Vermont's programs and new data to make informed choices about program offerings and delivery models.

Graduate with a Plan

Goal: increase the number of high school aged Vermonters who graduate with a career and education plan for after high school with the support of a trusted adult. It will:

- Provide **navigator training** to better equip student-serving adults (from teachers to employers) to support students in exploration and planning.
- Develop and pilot a **model curriculum** for career and education planning in middle and high schools.
