- I. New Bills in Committee
  - A. S.34 An act relating to lowering the rate of increase for mobile home lot rents
  - B. S.37 An act relating to unemployment insurance eligibility and benefits
  - C. S.48 An act relating to workforce leadership in Vermont
- II. Bill Activity
  - A. S.37
    - Goal of bill: to give school support staff access to the basic right to apply for unemployment insurance
    - VNEA:
      - Support staff are vital, but underpaid and underemployed; UI provides a fill-in for summer interim
      - Retention of support staff is crucial, and without access to UI staff are being lost to higher paying jobs
    - Dept. of Labor:
      - Instructional nature of paraeducator role may mean bill does not conform to federal policy on UI

- Predicts significant uptake of UI in VT and estimates costs to be
  ~\$16M, ultimately increasing cost to tax-payers
- Sen. Brock: Question of cost
  - VNEA cited Minnesota to demonstrate lower than expected cost:
    \$5M (EPI analysis)
- Sen. Brock: Question on condition of UI requiring an individual to be actively looking for work
  - Return to Work Provision exempts those with a reasonable

assurance of return to work within 10-week window
