CTE LEARNERS GRADUATE AND EARN AT HIGHER RATES









Students who were CTE concentrators earned **\$3,359** more per year than non-CTE students.

In Addison County, for FY26, all public education spending will be \$123 million dollars. Our budget is \$5.79 million.

We are only 4.45% of the entire spending done in Addison County on public education, yet we serve 1 in 3 high school students.
