

#### **Building Communities Grants**

The Department of Buildings and General Services administers the following grants:

- Recreational Facilities Grants
- Human Services & Educational Facilities Grants
- Regional Economic Development Grant Program

Applications for these grants are issued on an annual basis in the Fall of each year. Awarded grantees can receive up to \$25,000 and have two years to complete their project. Funding decisions are made by individual committees for each program established in Title 24 V.S.A. Chapter 137 and are based on factors such as community support and fundraising, matching funds from their bottom line, investments, or other grants, and the ability to begin the project once awarded. In FY 2025, a total of 114 applications were received across the four grant categories and totaled \$1,812,052.64 in grant funds.

Applicants must be a non-profit organization, regional economic development organization, or municipalities, and match funding is required.

#### Recreational Facilities Grants

The Recreational Facilities Grants Program provides competitive grants to municipalities and non-profit organizations to stimulate the creation and development of recreational opportunities in Vermont communities.

Town of Bennington: \$20,000 to create a large concrete bowl addition to the proposed skate park

Human Services and Educational Facilities Grants Program provides competitive grants to municipalities and to non-profit organizations for capital costs associated with the major maintenance, and renovation or development of facilities for the delivery of human services and health care needs in Vermont communities.



### Examples of FY 25 funded projects

Windham County; Neighborhood Connections Inc: \$8,985 awarded to Kitchen Renovation to bring the kitchen into compliance with industry food safety standards

Windsor County; Springfield Hospital: \$10,000 awarded to replace elevator cables for safe use and ADA accessibility compliance

Addison County; Vermont Foodbank: \$15,688 awarded to provide last-gap funding for renovations of the Rutland facility - installing a commercial grade freezer



# Regional Economic Development Grant Program

The Regional Economic Development Grant program provides competitive grants for capital costs associated with major maintenance, renovation, or planning related to the development of facilities reasonably expected to create job opportunities in Vermont communities. Projects must promote financial engagement in either an individual community or recognized community service area.

### Examples of FY 25 funded projects

Franklin County; on behalf of Red House Sweets: \$7,500 awarded to Add second/larger oven and hood to increase capacity to meet customer demand and improve entryway flooring.

Rutland County; on behalf of Ana's Empandas: \$11,961 awarded to Purchase commercial kitchen equipment for new retail location in Downtown Rutland.

Washington County; on behalf of Meadow Mart: \$4,600 awarded to purchase and install dedicated produce cooler.
