Funding Spotlight: MVSD Summer Internship Program

The MVSD Summer Internship Program fosters hands-on community partnerships by connecting students with local businesses and organizations. This initiative is a direct response to local and statewide challenges including: the declining soft work skills in young people, a high need for community involvement and civic responsibility, and the aging workforce population in Vermont. With this program, we are reigniting engagement amongst our young people and highlighting the myriad opportunities they have to find success and fulfillment here in their home state.

This program requires a culminating learning project that develops both technical and interpersonal skills, while giving back to the community and providing insights into active citizenship. The district pays students for their work in this program, which allows for participating employers to hire extra support during the busy summer months, as well as develops a talent pipeline by engaging with motivated, home-grown future professionals.

We support students in the process from start to finish. Resumé building, application and interview support, onboarding skill development, leadership coaching, and weekly mentor check-ins throughout their internship experience. **This opportunity offers students five weeks of paid internship work at \$15/hr for 15- 20 hours a week**.
