Good morning, my name is Henrigaud Bellevue and I'm a resident of Barre. I'm here to speak about my experience with Central Vermont Adult Education. Thank you for having me.

I left Haiti in 2019. I wanted to come to the US for more opportunities. I first moved to Florida, where I have family. I was only there for a few months. I came to Vermont to visit other family members, and I really liked it, so I ended up staying.

My goal was to go to college and get a better job. Because of the language barrier that couldn't happen. CVAE made it possible.

I joined the Vermont Army National Guard, which gave me college benefits and allowed me to become a citizen in 2023.

When I first got to Vermont I didn't know any English. I couldn't get a job. I couldn't talk to people in my community, and I couldn't continue my schooling. My brother already lived here and had been going to CVAE, and only a few days after I arrived I also started going to school there.

I started learning how to speak English. That allowed me to get a get a job in retail and to pass the ASVAB so I could join the National Guard. I then started learning how to read and write in English. That gave me a lot of confidence, and I stopped having fear of not being understood. I started at CVAE with no English skills, and now I'm doing well in college.

I still work in retail, and I'm also taking classes at CCV. My goal is to do 2 years in the Allied Health program there, and then transfer to the X-ray Tech program at Vermont State University or enter the ROTC program at Norwich University or University of Vermont.

I wouldn't be where I am now and have the opportunities I have without CVAE. I wouldn't be able to speak with confidence. Coming to classes every week motivates me,82 and I feel like I can do it. It has also helped me to see where I can go in life. They have given me a lot

of advice. There's no way I could be successful in college without what I've learned at CVAE. I definitely couldn't have joined the military and become a citizen.

In Haiti it would cost hundreds of dollars to learn English. CVAE has been free, and I couldn't have done it if it cost me money here. It has changed my life.
