UVM is helping Vermont address the statewide nursing shortage, thanks to a recent \$16 million estate gift that will expand nursing scholarships.



FY27 Requests

1. **3% inflationary increase to the general fund appropriation to**
 - *allow UVM to maintain levels of need-based student aid for Vermont students*
 - *fund tuition discounting for Vermonters at the Larner College of Medicine*
 - *support for UVM Extension programs across all 14 counties*
2. **\$1 million per year for 5 years to support the UVM Cancer Center**  *in order to provide expanded care in rural communities, including a newly minted mobile unit.*
3. **\$15 million** *proposed by Governor Scott to support the construction of the Multipurpose Center to provide a venue for all Vermonters.*
