



FY27 Requests



- 1. 3% inflationary increase to the general fund appropriation to**
 - allow UVM to maintain levels of need-based student aid for Vermont students*
 - fund tuition discounting for Vermonters at the Larner College of Medicine*
 - support for UVM Extension programs across all 14 counties*
- 2. \$1 million per year for 5 years to support the UVM Cancer Center *in order to provide expanded care in rural communities, including a newly minted mobile unit.***
- 3. \$15 million proposed by Governor Scott to support the construction of the Multipurpose Center *to provide a venue for all Vermonters.***
