Overview of Vermont's Al Governance

Establishing a Responsible Al Framework

- Act 132 (2022): Established the Division and Council on Artificial Intelligence within the Agency of Digital Services.
- Mandate: Oversee AI systems in state government, ensuring ethical use and public engagement.
- 2025 Report Focus: Evaluates the future scope and structure of AI oversight in Vermont.

Expanding and Strengthening Al Oversight

Key Recommendations - 2025 Al Council Report

- **Broaden Scope:** Extend AI oversight beyond state government to include private sector applications.
- Educational Role: Position the AI Division and Council as hubs for best practices and governance frameworks.
- Workforce Development: Support businesses and workers in adapting to Al-driven changes.
- Ethical Standards: Continue refining the Code of Ethics and operational guidance for Al use.



Anticipating Al Challenges and Opportunities

Preparing for the Future of AI in Vermont

- Emerging Technologies: Monitor developments like Agentic AI and their potential applications.
- Risk Mitigation: Address concerns related to Al misuse, including cyber threats and biased systems.
- **Policy Development:** Collaborate on state, regional, and federal levels to craft comprehensive AI policies.
- **Public Engagement:** Ensure transparency and involve citizens in discussions about AI implementation.

Legislative Considerations

Charting Vermont's AI Policy Path Forward

- Legislative Actions: Consider expanding the Al Division's scope to include private sector oversight.
- Resource Allocation: Provide necessary funding and support for the Al Division and Council's expanded roles.
- Stakeholder Engagement: Facilitate collaboration between government, industry, and the public on AI initiatives.
- Ongoing Evaluation: Establish mechanisms for regular review and adaptation of Al policies and practices.


