Primary Actors/Technologies

- Caller
 - Telephone (mobile or landline)
 - Voice or text
 - 911 system or direct to dispatcher
- 911 call taker
 - Located at public safety answering points (6 PSAPs in VT)
 - 2 PSAPs operated by VT State Police (Williston and Westminster)
 - Routes call to appropriate dispatcher
 - Telephone
 - Emergency Services IP Network (ESINet) – statewide fiber network connecting call takers with dispatchers
 - Hardware and software/applications
- Dispatcher
 - Over 30 in Vermont
 - Municipal; regional; State police operated PSAPs
 - Hardware and software/applications
 - Land Mobile Radio (LMR) systems (narrowband; wide coverage area)
- First responders
 - EMTs, law enforcement officers, firefighters, paramedics, etc.
 - LMR systems
 - FirstNet - Statewide public safety radio access network (Band 14)
 - Vermont Communications System (VCOMM) – interoperable radio coverage and alternate when primary LMR not working, Radio Technology Services, Department of Public Safety
