I am writing in support for H.276, the Vermont Climate Resilience and State Wildlands Act.

This would seem to demand congressional support considering that this Camels Hump State Forest came about from a gift of 1200 acres from Joseph Battell in 1911 and written into the deed was "Trees growing on the land herein conveyed are not to be cut - and the whole forest is to be preserved in a primeval state by planting or natural growth". Known as a wilderness visionary, Battell explained at the time that this gift was to protect the forest from the Lumber Industry.

I am not a lawyer, it would seem to me that any permitted logging would be a violation of Battell 's gift to the State and its deed.

So I am solidly in favor this bill which will also protect other State Forests which we have largely because of conservation efforts and belief of Vermonters over the past 100 plus years.
