RE: Housing and other G&H Priorities for the 2025 Budget

Here are the Committee's priorities for the proposed FY2026 budget. We also list for reference the corresponding element of the Administration budget.

HOUSING

Our approach to the priority tiers favors elements that will directly produce housing or housing infrastructure. The difference between the Committee proposals and the Administration budget is approximately \$25 million.

Tier 1. First Priority

These key programs directly produce housing or related infrastructure.
