# Introduction to Windham & Windsor Housing Trust

Founded in 1987 with a mission to strengthen the communities of Southeast Vermont through the development and stewardship of permanently affordable housing and through ongoing support and advocacy for its residents.

## Organizational Impact across 2 counties

- 887 affordable apartments
  - 113 new units in pipeline, 25 of which will come online this summer.
- 42 mobile home lots in three parks
- 16 commercial units
- 145 Shared Equity Homes
- Homebuyer education over 650 in the last five years
- Homeownership counseling 1217 in the last five years
- New homebuyers 229 in last five years
- Green Mountain Home repair average of 25 per year
- Vermont Housing Improvement Program 210 units since 9/2020
  - 125 units currently in construction. Another 25 in application stage
- 3 SASH Panels (Windsor, Dover, Brattleboro) serving over 200 residents

#### Tight housing market


Out of state buyers increased 38% during pandemic years


The percentage of seasonal use homes in Windham (30%) and Windsor (23%) counties is higher than the statewide average of 15%.

Brattleboro, the largest population center we serve, has identified the need for 500 new homes.


# Rising homelessness


Comparison, population percentage to unhoused and emergency housed population percentage, 2020 & 2024
