## STRENGTHENING TENANT RIGHTS AND PROTECTIONS

- Support Statewide "Just Cause" Eviction Protections
- Expand Fair Housing Protected Classes for Citizenship & Immigration Status
- Support Rent Stabilization & Reintroduction of H.135
- Limit Security Deposits to One Month's Rent Statewide
- Require Landlord Rental Law Education
- Remove "+1%" From MHC Lot Rent Increase Threshold
- Clarify MHC Lot Habitability Standards for Erosion & Flooding
- Set Minimum Water Supply Standards During MHC Outages

- Fund a Feasibility Study & Infrastructure for Four New MHCs Containing 600 Lots

18 mobile home parks (1,632 lots) impacted by 3-acre stormwater rule

**7.2%** of Vermont housing units are manufactured homes
