- Federal Law
 - Uniformed and Overseas Citizens Absentee Voting Act (1986)
 - Help America Vote Act (2002)
 - Military and Overseas Voter Empowerment Act (2009)

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Our Role during Elections:

- Annual Meeting yearly
 - Support town clerks in administering local elections
- Presidential Primary every 4 years
 - Receive candidate petitions
 - Prepare and print the ballots
 - Coordinate delivery of the ballots to towns
- State Primary every 2 years
 - Receive candidate petitions
 - Prepare and print the ballots
 - Coordinate delivery of the ballots to towns
- General Election every 4 years
 - Prepare and print the ballots
 - Coordinate Universal Vote-by-Mail





Immediately Post Elections:

Night of Election

(optional for local elections)

- Town clerks enter results into the Vermont Election Management System (VEMS)
- Election Night Results (optional for local elections)
 - VEMS provides unofficial results online in almost real time.
- Official Return of Votes
 - Due 48 hours after polls close, allows clean-up of write-ins
- Certification of Results
 - Canvass committees certify winners
- Election Results Audit





The Different Ways Vermonters Vote:

- Annual Meeting yearly
 - Traditional Town Meeting and/or Australian Ballot
- Presidential Primary every 4 years
 - Have to Declare Party
- State Primary every 2 years
 - No Party Declaration
- General Election every 4 years
 - Universal Vote-by-Mail








Ensuring Election Security

- Cybersecurity
 - Built into our vendor contracts with multiple independent reviews
 - Coordinate and receive advice from the Agency of Digital Services
- Physical Security
 - Our Division provides training with State and Federal partners to Town Clerks related to physical layout, deescalation, and assessment of risk.
- Voter Checklist Maintenance
 - ERIC: Multi-State coordination of voter data
 - VT DMV

2024 Election Highlights

- Total votes: 372,885 record high
- Early/absentee votes: >230,000 (>60% of total, similar to 2022)
- ~520,000 registered record high
 - More than 6,900 same day registrations on Nov. 5
