9	(b) Specialty by examination. A psychologist-doctorate shall be eligible for
10	the prescribing specialty if the psychologist doctorate:
11	(1) holds a current license to practice psychology at the doctoral level in
12	the State;
13	(2) has successfully completed a postdoctoral training program in
14	psychopharmacology designated by the American Psychological Association
15	or its successor;
16	(3) has completed clinical rotations over a total of not less than 14
