
RE: Follow-up to February 13th Testimony: Vacancy Rates; Milton Family Medicine;

Howard Center Community Outreach

During the Department's (DMH's) February 13th testimony, the Committee requested additional information on the following:

1. Data regarding the proportion of administrative and clinical vacancies across the Designated Agency system:

The most recent vacancy report submitted to DMH contains point-in-time data from October 1, 2024.



The average vacancy rate on October 1, 2024 across all VCP member agencies was **14.4%**, with 913 out of 6,029 positions open. The range in overall vacancy rates by agency ranged from a low of 5% to a high of 26%.



For clinical positions related to Mental Health and Substance Use, the average vacancy rate on October 1, 2024 was **18.4%**, with rates ranging from 12.5% to 30.48% across agencies.

For positions in the Administrative/Other category, the average vacancy rate on October 1, 2024, was **6.4%**, with rates ranging from 0.0% to 11.5% across agencies.


2. Milton Family Medicine's Blueprint for Health status:

The <u>University of Vermont Health Network Family Medicine – Milton</u> practice is enrolled in the Blueprint for Health as a Patient Centered Medical Home (PCMH) and as a Spoke in the Blueprint's Hub and Spoke program. Additionally, Family Medicine – Milton is engaged in the Blueprint's Mental Health and Substance Use Integration Expansion and Pregnancy Intention programs.

3. Additional data on Howard Center's Community Outreach Program:

For FY24, HC Community Outreach had 2256 total contacts. 1494 (66%) were phone calls, and 762 (34%) were in person. Of 2256 total contacts, there were 891 individuals contacted.

HC Community Outreach is active in 9 towns: Winooski, Williston, South Burlington, Shelburne, Richmond, Milton, Hinesburg, Essex, and Colchester.





The four most common reasons for HC Community Outreach service are:

- 1. Emotional/Behavioral/Mental Health concern 1459 total contacts (65%)
- 2. Family conflict 129 total contacts (5.7%)
- 3. Housing instability 92 total contacts (4.0%)
- 4. Unhoused 88 total contacts (3.9%)
