Vermont Department of Health House Human Services Committee February 26, 2025



Outreach and Case Management

 \$1,976,000 to the Department of Health Fund 26 outreach or case management staff positions within the preferred provider network for the provision of services that increase motivation of and engagement with individuals with substance use disorder in settings such as police barracks, shelters, social service organizations, and elsewhere in the community.

Burlington Overdose Prevention Center

 \$1,100,000 to the Department of Health For the purpose of awarding grants to the City of Burlington for establishing an overdose prevention center upon submission of a grant proposal that has been approved by the Burlington City Council and meets the requirements of 18 V.S.A. § 4256, including the guidelines developed by the Department of Health

Recovery Residences

 \$1,200,000 to Department of Health For recovery residences certified by the Vermont Alliance for Recovery Residences, including at least two new recovery residences certified by the Vermont Alliance for Recovery Residences

Syringe Services

- \$1,050,000 to the Department of Health
- \$700,000 to support current providers of existing syringe service programs for HIV and Harm Reduction Services
- \$350,000 to support new syringe service programs to increase the geographical distribution of Harm Reduction Services

Contingency Management Services

 \$800,000 to the Department of Health Grants to providers for ongoing support for contingency management
