Recidivism Dashboard	Interactive dashboard including annual recidivism information disaggregated by Race and Gender since 2014. Citation-2011 Act 41 Section 5: "The Department shall calculate the rate of recidivism based upon offenders who are sentenced to more than one year of incarceration who, after release from incarceration, return to prison within three years for a conviction for a new offense or a violation of supervision resulting, and the new incarceration sentence or time served on the violation is at least 90 days." The definition of a prison sentence is sentenced to serve (maximum) more than one year (US Department of Justice, Bureau of Justice Statistics). Thus, recidivism does NOT include the incarcerated individuals released each year with a shorter "jail" sentence of one year or less. Note: Due to the definition of recidivism provided in the above citation, the most up-to-date recidivism calculation is for 3 years prior to the current calendar year. Segregation Report	Longitudinal analyses reporting on restrictive housing (segregation) for all incarcerated individuals placed in segregation.	Research & Data-Annual Reports	Annually
Budget Performance Measures	As part of the annual budget report, the VT DOC provides performance measures for programs and services provided by the VT DOC. These programs and services include Correctional Services (incarcerated, community supervision, parole board), Health Services (mental and physical health, MAT), Program and Services (education, VT Correctional Industries, Behavior and Life Skill Interventions, transitional housing, restorative justice services, non-driver ID requests), Office of Professional Standards and Compliance (Academy, professional development, constituency services, Prison and Rape Elimination Act, Special Teams), and Department-Wide Services (Policy Development Unit, Corrections Investigative Unit, Central Operations Division). FACT Pilot Program Preliminary Report	Infographic with preliminary results for the FACT program. Established in July 2022, the FACT program is a partnership among the Vermont Departments of Mental Health (DMH), Corrections (DOC), and Health (VDH). The multidisciplinary team includes Pathways staff—a nurse, peer specialist, housing supports, and psychiatrist—along with DOC Probation and Parole staff. FACT stands for Forensic Assertive Community Treatment. FACT is recognized by the Substance Abuse and Mental Health Services Administration (SAMHSA) to be a promising practice that blends criminogenic risk management, substance use, and mental health management, with a focus on improving social determinants and health equity.
