7	Statement of purpose of bill as introduced: This bill proposes to create a new
8	felony statute for an individual who abuses a corpse. Specifically, this bill
9	makes it a felony for an individual to transport or destroy a corpse without
10	legal authorization. Additionally, this bill creates an aggravated felony penalty
11	for actions taken against a corpse to conceal a crime or otherwise avoid the
12	consequences of the commission of a crime.

14	It is hereby enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Vermont:
15	Sec. 1. 13 V.S.A. § 2312 is added to read:
16	§ 2312. ABUSE OF A CORPSE
17	(a) A person is guilty of abuse of a corpse if the person, without legal
18	authorization, knowingly:
19	(1) transports, buries, or otherwise hides a corpse; or

1	(2) burns, mutilates, disfigures, dismembers, or otherwise destroys a
2	corpse.
3	(b) A person is guilty of aggravated abuse of a corpse if the person
4	intentionally:
5	(1) transports, buries, or otherwise hides a corpse to conceal a crime or
6	avoid apprehension, prosecution, or conviction of a crime;
7	(2) burns, mutilates, disfigures, dismembers, or otherwise destroys a
8	corpse to conceal a crime or avoid apprehension, prosecution, or conviction of
9	a crime; or
10	(3) perpetrates or attempts to perpetrate sexual assault against a corpse.
11	(c)(1) A person who commits the crime of abuse of a corpse shall be
12	imprisoned for not more than five years or fined not more than \$5,000.00, or
13	both.
14	(2) A person who commits the crime of aggravated abuse of a corpse
15	shall be imprisoned for not less than five years and a maximum term of 10
16	years and may be fined not more than \$10,000.00.
