ACCESS CONTROL AND VISITOR MANAGEMENT POLICY 9 (a) Each supervisory union board, member district board, or supervisory 10 district board shall adopt an access control and visitor management policy that, 11 at a minimum, requires the following: 12 (1) that That all school sites and supervisory union and supervisory 13 district offices lock exterior doors during the school day. The policy shall and
 - district offices lock exterior doors during the school day. The policy shall and require that all visitors sign in at a centralized location prior to gaining full access to the school or office site. If a school recognizes a need to leave a specific structure unlocked as needed for agricultural, recreational, or other reasonably practical purposes directly related to a school's mission or curriculum, it may justify leaving that structure unlocked in its visitor policy.
 - (2) That no employee of a school allow a federal immigration authority, as that term is defined in Vermont's Model Fair and Impartial Policing Policy, access to a nonpublic area of a school, including a classroom, without the

1	authority presenting a judicial warrant to the employee. A federal immigration
2	detainer or other warrant or request from a federal immigration authority shall
3	not constitute a judicial warrant. An employee that denies access to a
4	nonpublic area of a school to a federal law authority because the employee in

14	General, shall develop a model policy on the regulation of visitor access to
15	schools in the State that furthers the intent of 16 V.S.A. § 1484. The Agency
16	shall consider the security and privacy of students and staff members in the
17	development of the model policy. The model policy shall be completed on or
18	before December 1, 2025 and be sent to all schools for adoption on or before
19	<u>December 31, 2025.</u>
