I am writing to state that our ICE and Police Officers were nothing but professional during the entire episode on Dorset Street in South Burlington.

I watched as the activists' texts went out - telling protesters to come to the site. I watched early protesters say the vilest things 2 inches from ICE officers faces. I watched as a woman sexually "twerked" for hours 2 inches from ICE officers. I listened as males called female ICE officers the C-word. The entire time ICE officers just stood there - doing their job. Personally, I don't know how they remained so professional when the crowd was anything but.
