- In 2024 Governor Scott approved my nomination to be named the Motorized representative to the Vermont Outdoor Recreation Economic Collaborative (VOREC)



What is VASA

- VASA is a member-based association that manages the ATV and SXS network here in Vermont
- Vermont hosts roughly 1,000 miles of trail, with a majority of trail being hosted by private landowners
- VASA also hosts educational classes for riders needing to complete the Youth Safety Course (online & in person)
- VASA is also responsible for the maintenance of the trails and hosts a trails team and construction equipment.



Law Enforcement


- ▶ VASA carries a budget line item to support patrols on the trail network.
- ▶ Most patrols are conducted by the game wardens and then the remainder is through local sheriff offices and one municipality.
- ▶ VASA receives reports on tickets and stops to assist in the education of safe riding



Trail Maintenance

- ▶ VASA owns several pieces of equipment to work on our trails throughout the year
- ▶ All maintenance is done in accordance to the NOHVCC Great Trails Program which is also approved by the State of Vermont
- ▶ The Best Management Practice (BMP) is always reviewed and changed to support sustainability of trails, particularly through large scale weather events
- ▶ Our funding is supported through our Trail Access Deval Program and support from the RTP Grant Program.
- ▶ Our Trails Team has 3 employees with specialized trainings and required Professional Development
- ▶ VASA has won national awards for their work in the National Forest







SAFETY!!!

- This of course is our top priority
- Youth riders under the age of 18 are required to take a course (online or in person)
- Helmets are required
 - DOT certified for traditional ATV
 - Sport rated if in a SXS
