H.458 (Act 48): Signed by Governor Scott on 6.5.2025

Intent: For the Agency of Digital Services to provide the General Assembly and the public with more transparency about the scope, budget, and overall status of certain information technology projects being managed by the Agency. This act requires the Agency to include more details about information technology projects it manages in its <u>annual reporting</u> as well as on its <u>publicly available website</u> in the form of a current projects inventory.
