Dear Representatives and Senators with an interest in land use and conservation,

I'm reaching out to share with you all below this email a newsletter from Vermont's largest regional Planning Commission "TRORC."

I serve as a commissioner on this Regional Planning Commission (RPC) and wanted to point you to them sharing publicly about their implementation of Act 181 (2024)

to update their "Future Land Use Maps." We at Rural Vermont believe in the good work behind Act 181 (2024) but we have to underscore that it didn't include a mandate

to project where land can be used for food production in the future.

Agricultural land is under a series of conversion rists, including land use changes through projected housing development and land losses to climate change impacts such as extended watersheds and soil erosion. As a commissioner I know first hand that it is an uphill battle to get the planning commissions to do a little more than what they're mandated to do - many might reject devoting any additional capacity beyond their existing mandates with good reason. We are doing grassroots outreach on this issue but know that it will be extremely difficult to get all Regional Planning Commissions to issue Future Agricultural Land Use maps without a legislative mandate that would coordinate this effort.

Therefore we recommend for this second half of the session to find a legislative vehicle for our recommendation to mandate RPC's to develop specific

"Future Agricultural Land Use Maps" that would be a **non-legally binding recommendation** in map form that would show where agricultural land is and where there's

potential to bring underutilized ag land back into food production and additional acres of land into agricultural use as well. As Ryan Patch from the Vermont Agency of

Agriculture, Food and Markets testified to the House - Vermont would need to approximately double its land in agricultural production to even just produce 30%

of the food consumed in the State. This work would be an important next tangible step as the basis for the planning phase of Act 59 (2023) which didn't include in its

inventory phase a "community resilience" related inventory of agricultural land needed for local-self reliance by 2030 and 2050.

A sound projection of the agricultural land at stake is needed to plan for new incentives for food resilience as well as for advanced discourse on Land Access policies needed to make farmland more affordable to farmers.

Please identify "agriculture and local food production" as <u>a public interest in land use planning</u> and include agricultural land use in the 2025 revision of all future land use maps by Regional Planning Commissions (RPC's). Here's our recommendation as submitted to the House on 3/12. We look forward to speaking about this and other issues with both committees during our Small Farm Action Day on March 26.

DRAFT language:

"Regional Planning Commissions are mandated to develop Future Agricultural Land Use Maps that layout a recommendation to protect farmland from development as part of their Land Use revision of their regional plans. Future Agricultural Land Use Maps shall delineate more than what's currently included in soil type maps. They should build the basis for subsequent policy considerations for how and where Vermont would need to protect farmland from development to move towards the regional goal of New England Feeding New England towards more local-self reliance. For subsequent policy considerations, the Future Agricultural Land Use Maps layers shall visualize:

- 1. Current Agricultural Land (sourced from ANR)
- 2. Prime Ag Soils (sources from ANR)
- 3. Soils of State Relevance (sourced from ANR)
- 4. Agricultural Land in Current Use (sourced from Dep. Taxes)
- 5. Agricultural Land in Easements (sourced VHCB, VLT etc.)
- 6. Current Agricultural Land Certified Organic (sourced from NOFA-VT)
- 7. Conversion risk 1: Projected Farmland loss as Critical Resource Area (sourced from Act 250 review Board)
- 8. Conversion risk 2: Projected Farmland loss to retirement of a farmer 65+ yrs (sourced from American Farmland Trust, VAAFM, NRCS)
- 9. Conversion risk 3: Projected Farmland loss to development (sourced from Regional Planning Commissions)
- 10. Underutilized Agricultural Land needed in production to reach NEFNE 30x30 goal (RPC recommendation based on New England Feeding New England Data)
- 11. Additional Agricultural Land needed in production to reach NEFNE 30x30 goal (RPC recommendation based on New England Feeding New England Data)"

Please include this recommendation in your considerations for discussion. I would be happy to make myself available for testimony on this issue.
