

Strengthening families so that children can thrive

Lund has been helping Vermonters since 1890. Our programs work in tandem to support over **6,000 people** each year across Vermont.



ADOPTION

Lund is Vermont's oldest and largest nonprofit adoption agency, which has finalized over 11,500 adoptions! At Lund, we believe every child deserves a family, and every child is adoptable. We're with families every step of the way, and also provide post permanency support to families after adoption finalization.

CLINICAL TREATMENT

Lund offers substance use screening and assessment, virtual and in-person substance use and mental health outpatient treatment, and residential treatment. Our Residential Treatment Program is the only place in Vermont where pregnant and parenting people can live with their 0-5 aged child during their residential treatment.



PARENT CHILD CENTER

Lund's Parent Child Center serves all families with young children across Chittenden County. Our Kids-A-Part program works to minimize trauma experienced by a child with a parent in prison, our Home Visiting Program offers parent and child development education to families in their own homes, and DULCE (Developmental Understanding & Legal Collaboration for Everyone) provides universal prevention for families with newborns.

INVESTMENT IN VERMONT CHILDREN AND FAMILIES

Lund requesting the following support:

- Support for the Kids-A-Part Parenting Program (KAPPP) expansion bill—H.219.
 KAPPP has been serving incarcerated parents and their families for over two decades, demonstrating a proven track record of fostering better outcomes for both incarcerated individuals and their children. This ask is two-fold:
 - Requesting an additional \$276,207.22 be added to the FY26 DOC budget to support the implementation of an expansion pilot at Northern State Correctional Facility for fathers
 - Requesting an additional \$114,869.38 to make the current KAPPP program at CRCF fiscally whole
- Funding allocation of \$478,280 for the six DULCE Family Specialists working within Vermont's pediatric practices to ensure that this vital program can continue.
 DULCE is a universal, evidence-based pediatric care model that promotes healthy newborn development, addresses the social needs of families, and fosters community well-being.
- Support and approval of the AHS budget
 (with the addition of additional funding
 for the Kids-A-Part Initiative and the
 DULCE Family Specialist salaries). Lund
 receives critical funding from four
 departments within the AHS Department.
