2 INVESTMENTS; FISCAL YEAR 2027 ONE-TIME CAPITAL
3 APPROPRIATIONS

4 (a) In fiscal year 2027, \$23,418,455 is appropriated from the Capital
5 Infrastructure Subaccount in the Cash Fund for Capital and Essential
6 Investments for the following:

7 (1) Department of Buildings and General Services:

8 (A) \$1,281,174 for statewide major maintenance;

9 (B) \$225,000 for statewide physical security enhancements;

10 (C) \$1,000,000 for statewide three-acre parcel stormwater
11 compliance;

12 (D) \$3,600,000 for Asa Bloomer roof replacement;

13 (E) \$900,000 for Rutland multimodal garage renovation;

14 (F) \$3,000,000 for Burlington, 32 Cherry St. parking garage repairs;

15 (G) \$1,050,000 for the Agency of Human Services for HVAC
16 upgrades at correctional facilities;

17 (H) \$225,000 for the Agency of Human Services for statewide
18 correctional facilities security upgrades;

19 (I) \$2,700,000 for the Agency of Human Services for door control
20 upgrades at correctional facilities;

21 (J) \$1,000,000 for the Agency of Human Services for the Northern
22 State Correctional Facility boiler replacement;

1 (K) \$772,557 for the Agency of Human Services for the Department
2 for Children and Families' youth short-term stabilization facility;

3 (L) \$500,000 for the Department of Public Safety for an Urban
4 Search and Rescue (USAR) facility;

5 (M) \$1,600,000 for the Judiciary for renovations at the White River
6 Junction courthouse; and

7 (N) \$500,000 for the Agency of Human Services for maintenance
8 and renovations at the Chittenden Regional Correctional Facility.

9 (2) Department of Housing and Community Development, Division for
10 Historic Preservation:

11 (A) \$250,000 for the Historic Preservation Grant Program; and

12 (B) \$250,000 for the Historic Barns Preservation Grant Program.

13 (3) Department of Environmental Conservation:

14 (A) \$2,498,000 for the State match for federal Drinking Water State
15 Revolving Fund; and

16 (B) \$150,000 for Waterbury Dam Penstock project cost overruns.

17 (4) Department of Forests, Parks and Recreation:

18 (A) \$400,000 for park infrastructure and rehabilitation, improvement,
19 and three-acre rule compliance.

20 (5) Department of Fish and Wildlife:

21 (A) \$200,000 for dam maintenance and safety planning.

22 (6) Judiciary:

23 (A) \$500,000 for the Essex County Courthouse connector project.

1 (7) Vermont Historical Society:

2 (A) \$566,724 for the replacement of a climate control unit.

3 (8) Department of Corrections:

4 (A) \$250,000 to work with the Agency of Digital Services to install a
5 Wi-Fi system in State correctional facilities that is appropriately designed to
6 address the safety, security, and confidentiality risks of the correctional
7 environment.

1 Sec. E.138 RENTER REBATE FISCAL YEAR 2027 BASE INCREASE;
2 ONE-TIME

3 (a) It is the intent of the General Assembly that the \$4,000,000 increase to
4 the appropriation in Sec. B.138 of this act be a one-time increase in fiscal year
5 2027 that shall not recur in future fiscal years.

1 Sec. E.311.1 DIGITAL YOUTH-BASED BEHAVIORAL PREVENTION
2 PROGRAM

3 (a) The Department of Health shall consider allocating \$1,000,000 in fiscal
4 year 2027 to support the implementation of a statewide, population-based
5 youth behavioral prevention program for youth between 13 and 18 years of
6 age. If it allocates funds for this purpose, the Department shall utilize a single,
7 secure digital platform to provide access to evidence-informed behavioral
8 health education resources, moderated peer support services, and confidential
9 virtual sessions with coaches and mental health professionals who are licensed
10 in Vermont. Services on the platform shall be accessible via mobile and web-
11 based formats, available in English and Spanish, provided at no cost to
12 participating youth and families, and not billed to Medicaid or a health
13 insurance plan.

1 Sec. G.100 EFFECTIVE DATES

2 (a) This section and Secs. C.100, C.101, C.102, C.103, C.104, C.105,
3 C.106, C.107, C.108, C.109, C.110, C.111, C.112, C.113, E.504.2, E.504.3,
4 and E.504.4 shall take effect on passage.

5 (b) Secs. E.307.1, E.307.2, E.307.3, and E.307.5 shall take effect on
6 October 1, 2026.

7 (c) Secs. E.111.1, E.111.2, E.307.4, and E.923 shall take effect on July 1,
8 2027.

9 (d) Sec. E.504.5 (16 V.S.A. § 4021(b)) shall take effect upon the
10 occurrence of the contingencies set forth in 2025 Acts and Resolves No. 73,
11 Sec. 70(f).

12 (e) Secs. E.100, E.111, E.236, E.306.2, E.329.2, and E.711 shall take effect
13 on August 15, 2026, provided that the official State revenue estimate for the
14 General Fund has not been reduced by one percent or more from the estimates
15 determined and assumed for purposes of the current fiscal year's
16 appropriations.

17 (f) All other sections shall take effect on July 1, 2026.
