1	TO THE HONORABLE SENATE:
2	The Committee on Economic Development, Housing and General Affairs to
3	which was referred House Bill No. 321 entitled "An act relating to
4	miscellaneous cannabis amendments" respectfully reports that it has
5	considered the same and recommends that the Senate propose to the House that
6	the bill be amended as follows:
7	First: By adding a new section to be Sec. 2a to read as follows:
8	Sec. 2a. 7 V.S.A. § 845 is amended to read:
9	§ 845. CANNABIS REGULATION FUND
10	(a) There is established the Cannabis Regulation Fund, which shall be
11	managed in accordance with 32 V.S.A. chapter 7, subchapter 5. The Fund
12	shall be maintained by the Cannabis Control Board.
13	(b) The Fund shall be composed of:
14	(1) all State application fees, annual license fees, renewal fees, and civil
15	penalties collected by the Board pursuant to chapters 33 (cannabis
16	establishments) and 37 (medical cannabis dispensaries) of this title;
17	(2) all annual and renewal fees collected by the Board pursuant to
18	chapter 35 (medical cannabis registry) of this title; and
19	(3) 70 percent of the cannabis excise tax revenue raised pursuant to 32
20	<u>V.S.A. § 7902</u> .
21	* * *

1	Second: By striking out Sec. 12, 7 V.S.A. § 910, in its entirety and
2	inserting in lieu thereof the following:
3	Sec. 12. 7 V.S.A. § 910 is amended to read:
4	§ 910. CANNABIS ESTABLISHMENT FEE SCHEDULE
5	The following fees shall apply to each person or product licensed by the
6	Board:
7	(1) Cultivators.
8	(A) Outdoor cultivators.
9	(i) Outdoor cultivator tier 1. Outdoor cultivators with up to 1,000
10	square feet of plant canopy or fewer than 125 cannabis plants in an outdoor
11	cultivation space shall be assessed an annual licensing fee of \$750.00 \$375.00.
12	(ii) Outdoor cultivator tier 2. Outdoor cultivators with up to 2,500
13	square feet of plant canopy in an outdoor cultivation space shall be assessed an
14	annual licensing fee of \$1,875.00 \$925.00.
15	(iii) Outdoor cultivator tier 3. Outdoor cultivators with up to
16	5,000 square feet of plant canopy in an outdoor cultivation space shall be
17	assessed an annual licensing fee of \$4,000.00 \$2,000.00.
18	(iv) Outdoor cultivator tier 4. Outdoor cultivators with up to
19	10,000 square feet of plant canopy in an outdoor cultivation space shall be
20	assessed an annual licensing fee of \$8,000.00 \$4,000.00.

1	(v) Outdoor cultivator tier 5. Outdoor cultivators with up to
2	20,000 square feet of plant canopy in an outdoor cultivation space shall be
3	assessed an annual licensing fee of \$18,000.00 \$9,000.00.
4	(vi) Outdoor cultivator tier 6. Outdoor cultivators with up to
5	37,500 square feet of plant canopy in an outdoor cultivation space shall be
6	assessed an annual licensing fee of \$34,000.00.
7	(B) Indoor cultivators.
8	(i) Indoor cultivator tier 1. Indoor cultivators with up to 1,000
9	square feet of plant canopy in an indoor cultivation space shall be assessed an
10	annual licensing fee of \$1,500.00.
11	(ii) Indoor cultivator tier 2. Indoor cultivators with up to 2,500
12	square feet of plant canopy in an indoor cultivation space shall be assessed an
13	annual licensing fee of $\$3,750.00$ $\$7,500.00$.
14	(iii) Indoor cultivator tier 3. Indoor cultivators with up to 5,000
15	square feet of plant canopy in an indoor cultivation space shall be assessed an
16	annual licensing fee of \$8,000.00 \$16,000.00.
17	(iv) Indoor cultivator tier 4. Indoor cultivators with up to 10,000
18	square feet of plant canopy in an indoor cultivation space shall be assessed an
19	annual licensing fee of \$16,000.00 \$32,000.00.

1	(v) Indoor cultivator tier 5. Indoor cultivators with up to 15,000
2	square feet of plant canopy in an indoor cultivation space shall be assessed an
3	annual licensing fee of \$36,000.00 \$72,000.00.
4	(vi) Indoor cultivator tier 6. Indoor cultivators with up to 25,000
5	square feet of plant canopy in an indoor cultivation space shall be assessed an
6	annual licensing fee of \$75,000.00.
7	(C) Mixed cultivator tiers.
8	(i) Mixed cultivator tier 1. Mixed cultivators with the following at
9	the same licensed premises shall be assessed an annual licensing fee of
10	\$2,250.00 <u>\$1,875.00</u> : up to 1,000 square feet of plant canopy in an indoor
11	cultivation space and up to 125 cannabis plants in an outdoor cultivation space.
12	(ii) Mixed cultivator tier 2. Mixed cultivators with the following
13	at the same licensed premises shall be assessed an annual licensing fee of
14	\$5,625.00 <u>\$8,425.00</u> : up to 2,500 square feet of plant canopy in an indoor
15	cultivation space and up to 312 cannabis plants in an outdoor cultivation space.
16	(iii) Mixed cultivator tier 3. Mixed cultivators with the following
17	at the same licensed premises shall be assessed an annual licensing fee of
18	\$5,500.00 <u>\$3,500.00</u> : up to 1,000 square feet of plant canopy in an indoor
19	cultivation space and up to 625 cannabis plants in an outdoor cultivation space.
20	(iv) Mixed cultivator tier 4. Mixed cultivators with the following
21	at the same licensed premises shall be assessed an annual licensing fee of

1	\$9,500.00 \(\frac{\$5,500.00}{}\): up to 1,000 square feet of plant canopy in an indoor
2	cultivation space and up to 1,250 cannabis plants in an outdoor cultivation
3	space.
4	(v) Mixed cultivator tier 5. Mixed cultivators with the following
5	at the same licensed premises shall be assessed an annual licensing fee of
6	\$19,500.00 <u>\$10,500.00</u> : up to 1,000 square feet of plant canopy in an indoor
7	cultivation space and up to 2,500 cannabis plants in an outdoor cultivation
8	space.
9	* * *
10	(8) Trim and harvest services. Trim and harvest services shall be
11	assessed an annual licensing fee of \$500.00.
12	(9) Employees. Cannabis establishments licensed by the Board shall be
13	assessed an annual licensing fee of \$50.00 for each employee. The Board shall
14	offer one-year and two-year employee licenses.
15	(9)(10) Products. Cannabis establishments licensed by the Board shall
16	be assessed an annual a product licensing fee of \$50.00 per year for every type
17	of cannabis and cannabis product that is sold in accordance with this chapter.
18	Product registrations shall be valid for two years unless the Board determines,
19	through readily accessible published guidance, that such a registration should
20	be longer or shorter and shall be prorated at the same cost per year.

1	(10)(11) Local licensing fees. Cannabis establishments licensed by the
2	Board shall be assessed an annual local licensing fee of \$100.00 in addition to
3	each fee assessed under subdivisions (1)–(7) of this section. Local licensing
4	fees shall be distributed to the municipality in which the cannabis
5	establishment is located pursuant to section 846(c) of this title.
6	(11)(12) One time fees Application fee.
7	(A) All applicants for a cannabis establishment license shall be
8	assessed an initial one-time application fee of \$1,000.00.
9	(B) An applicant may choose to be assessed an initial one-time
10	intent to apply fee of \$500.00. If the applicant subsequently seeks a license
11	within one year after paying the intent to apply fee, the initial one time
12	application fee of \$1,000.00 shall be reduced by \$500.00.
13	Third: By inserting two new sections to be Secs. 15a and 15b to read as
14	follows:
15	Sec. 15a. CANNABIS SHOWCASE EVENT PERMIT PILOT
16	(a) A licensed retail cannabis establishment in good standing with the
17	Board may apply to the Board for a cannabis showcase event permit. Multiple
18	retailers may apply and be granted permission to participate in each event, but
19	the Board shall allow no more than five events between July 1, 2025 and
20	December 31, 2026, and such events shall be issued in geographically
21	dispersed locations.

1	(b) A permit issued under this section shall authorize the recipient to
2	coordinate, oversee, and be the responsible administrator of a single, defined
3	commercial event, held at a defined access-controlled location, for a defined
4	period not to exceed 24 hours, at which cannabis or cannabis products lawfully
5	may be purchased and possessed by screened participants acting in conformity
6	with terms set out by the Board in the issued permit.
7	(c) To be eligible for a cannabis showcase event permit, an applicant retail
8	cannabis establishment shall demonstrate to the Board's satisfaction:
9	(1) written approval to pursue a permit in the proposed location, from
10	the cannabis control commission created by the municipality pursuant to 7
11	V.S.A. § 863, if one exists, or from the local legislative body or designee;
12	(2) partnership with a minimum of three licensed cultivators or product
13	manufacturers that are in good standing with the Board and wholly
14	independent of the retail cannabis establishment and its affiliates who will be
15	showcased at the event;
16	(3) a security plan to ensure intoxicated persons or persons under 21
17	years of age cannot access the space subject to the permit, that the premises are
18	secured from diversion or inversion, and that the premises lawfully may be
19	used for the purpose intended;
20	(4) a product sale plan that describes quantities and types of cannabis
21	and cannabis products that will be offered for sale and explains how they will

1	be transported to the site, monitored, secured, displayed, and sold in
2	conformity with State law and Board rule;
3	(5) actual capacity and intent to administer and enforce and apply the
4	required plans;
5	(6) proof of commercially reasonable insurance for the proposed event;
6	<u>and</u>
7	(7) compliance with such other requirements as the Board may
8	prescribe.
9	(d) Deviation from security and sales plans, product tracking and taxation
10	requirements, or permit terms shall be a violation subject to adverse licensing
11	action consistent with Board rules.
12	(e) Permittee cannabis establishments shall be assessed a fee of \$250.00 to
13	apply for a Cannabis Showcase Event Permit of which 50 percent shall be
14	distributed to the host municipality and 50 percent shall be deposited in the
15	Cannabis Regulation Fund.
16	(f) The Board may adopt rules and forms necessary to implement this
17	section.
18	Sec 15b. CANNABIS RETAIL SALES REPORT
19	The Cannabis Control Board shall monitor and evaluate events authorized
20	under Sec. 15a of this act. The Board shall report to the House Committee on
21	Government Operations and Military Affairs and the Senate Committee on

1	Economic Development, Housing and General Affairs, on or before January
2	15, 2026, a concise assessment of the benefits, challenges, and administrative
3	viability of offering cannabis retail sales at events outside the confines of a
4	retail cannabis establishment. The Board may recommend best practices for,
5	among other considerations, security, inventory tracking, tax enforcement,
6	permit administration, local government coordination, and optimizing market
7	access for small cultivators.
8	Fourth: By striking out Sec. 16, effective date, in its entirety and inserting
9	in lieu thereof the following:
10	Sec. 16. EFFECTIVE DATES
11	This act shall take effect on July 1, 2025, except that Sec. 2a, 7 V.S.A.
12	§ 845, shall take effect on July 1, 2026.
