We believe that every Vermonter should be able to pursue and navigate a career and education path that meets their goals. It is essential to individual prosperity, and to the strengthen of our economy and community.

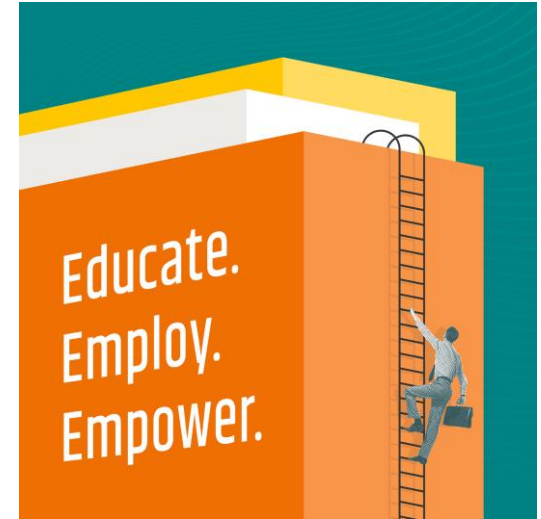
- Every high school student should **graduate with a plan** for their next steps.

Career Navigation

Components of career navigation

Component	Action	Definition
Acquiring knowledge	Self-assessment	Identifying and aligning one's skills, interests, values, and career goals.
	Career exploration	Gathering information about available and aligned careers and pathways.
Making informed career plans	Pathway mapping	Charting a course of education and work actions from one's current state to one's career goal.
Integrating and negotiating education, training, and work actions	Skill and credential acquisition	Attaining the skills, certifications, and experiences necessary to achieve one's goal.
	Job placement and advancement	Connecting to and acquiring jobs that lead to career advancement.

Career Navigation

Drivers of career navigation success



Information access and accuracy

Accurate knowledge of education and career opportunities, including pathways and economic outcomes data



Skills and credentials

Navigation skills and qualities (i.e., adaptability, self-efficacy), foundational skills, and job-specific skills and credentials



Social capital

Social relationships, networks, and engagement, which impact an individual's values, exposure, connections, and support



Wraparound resources and supports

The wraparound resources at one's disposal, including coaching, finances, technology, transportation and child care



Social structures and ecosystems

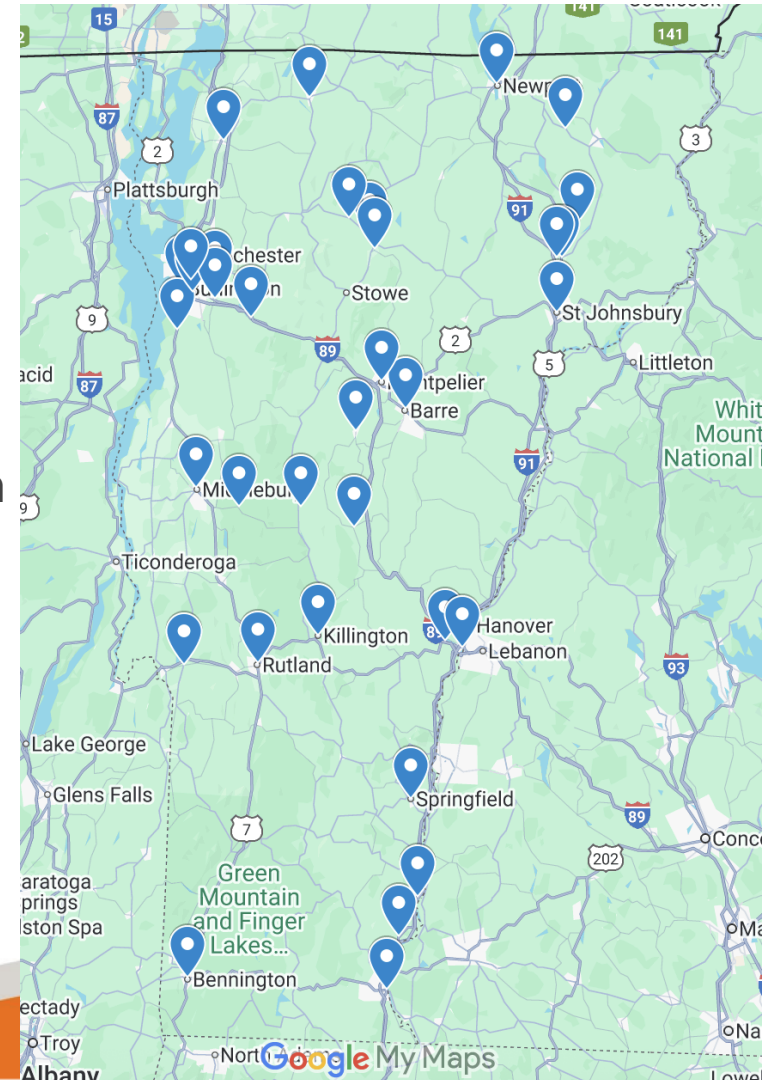
Social systems, including public and private policies, economic conditions, and discrimination and racism



The state's free tool to connect users to careers, in-state education, and support services.

In the last year:

- Expanded post-high school education options from 650 to 950.
- Doubled the database of support services from 69 to 138.
- Growth in schools, libraries, and other organizations sending their clients to MyFutureVT.

Graduate with a Plan

Problem: Too many students graduate without clear next steps

Goal: Every student should graduate with a plan for what comes next – whether that means college, training, volunteer service, or entering the workforce.

Assumptions:

- Students benefit from trusted adults
- Adults need training and tools to be effective navigators
- Schools/orgs need resources/tools to help schools operationalize and scale planning
- Collaboration among stakeholders maximizes impact and sustainability
- This is a long-game

Graduate with a plan



Navigator Training

Professional learning for influential adults — teachers, counselors, employers, mentors — focused on effective, equitable student guidance.



Career & Education Planning Framework

A comprehensive, practical guide for building capacity, aligning efforts, and helping all students develop informed, actionable post-high school plans.



Collaboration & Continuous Improvement

Guided by a skilled advisory committee and informed by data and feedback, GAP is built to evolve with the needs of Vermont's students and educators.

Landscape Scan

- **Current youth career and education planning falls short:** 75% of respondents rate it as only somewhat effective or less.
- **Future planning is insufficiently integrated:** Career and education planning remains siloed & inconsistent rather than embedded across schools and the broader school community.
- **Student serving adults need support:** They report wanting increased knowledge and skills to better advise students.



Legislative Priorities

- Lay the foundation to formalize pk-12 career navigation through pk-12 transformation & CTE reforms.
- Secure continued state support for Advance Vermont's work.
