- Merger of Vermont Affordable Housing Coalition & Vermont Coalition to End Homelessness

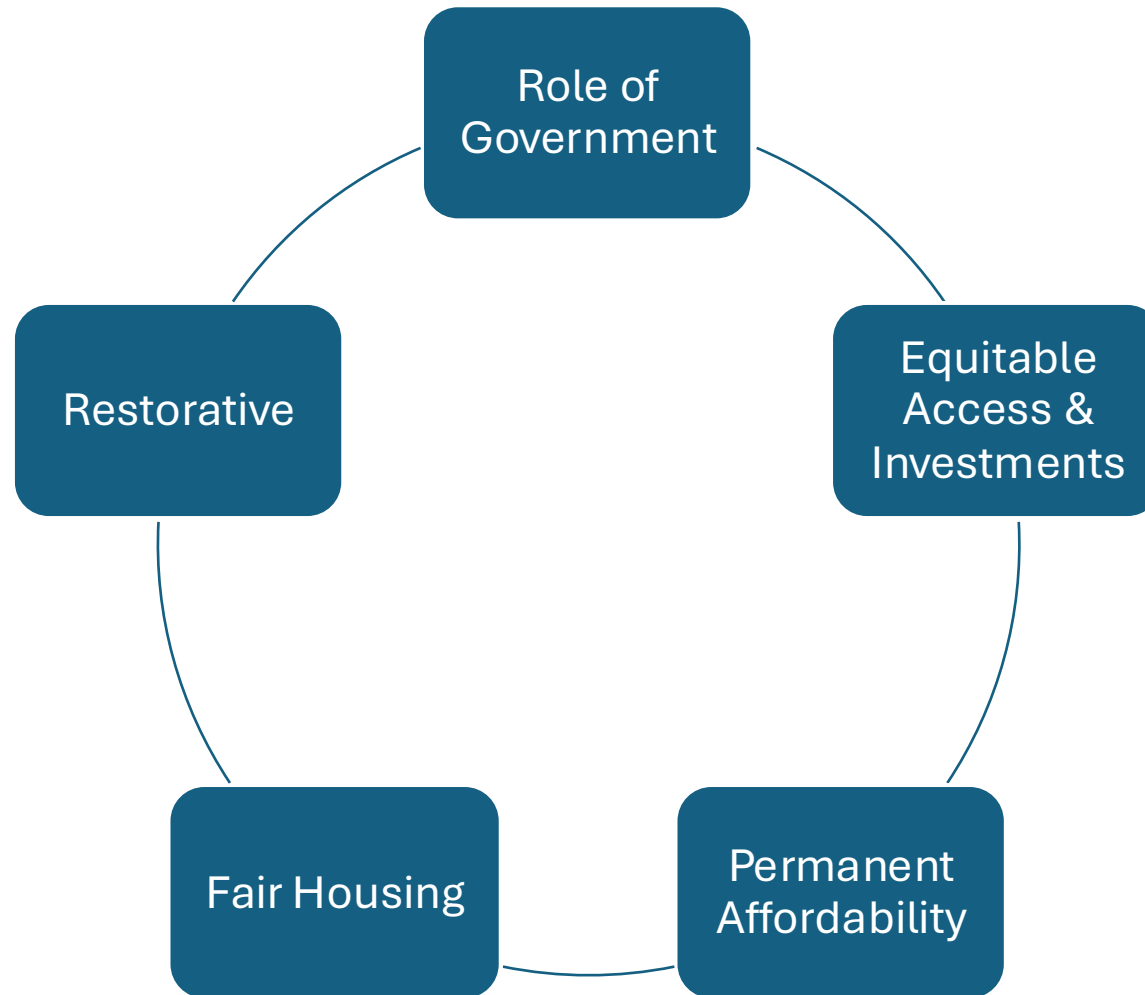

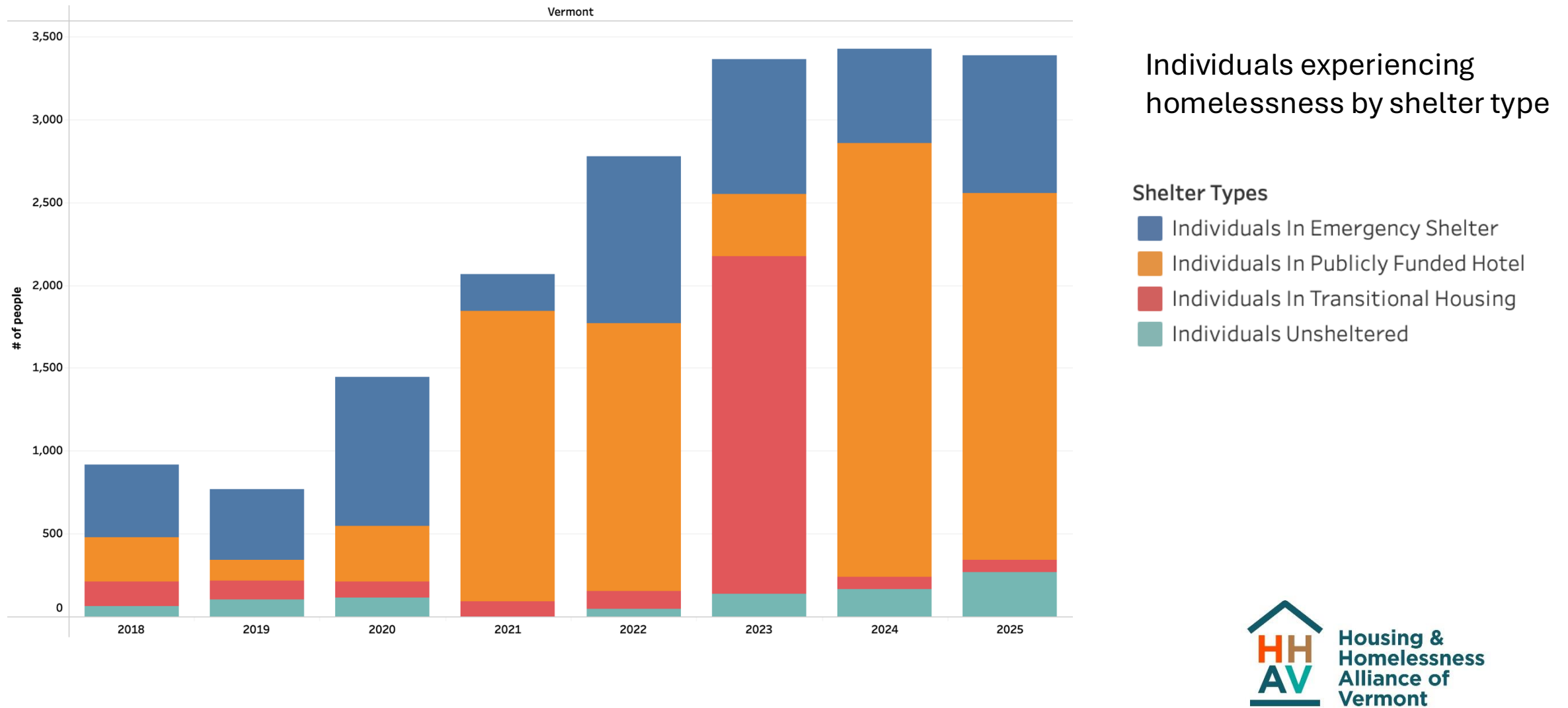

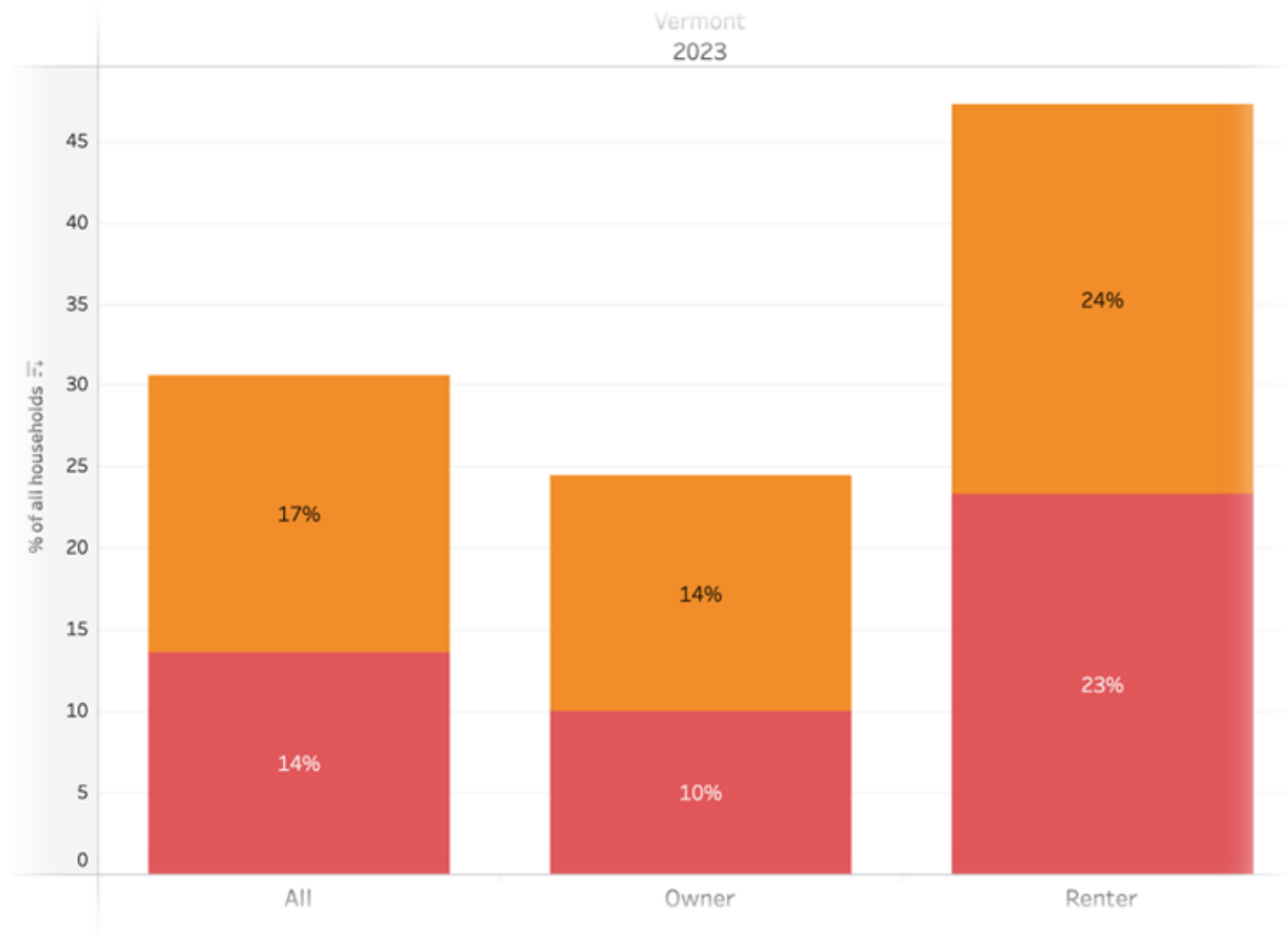

household income

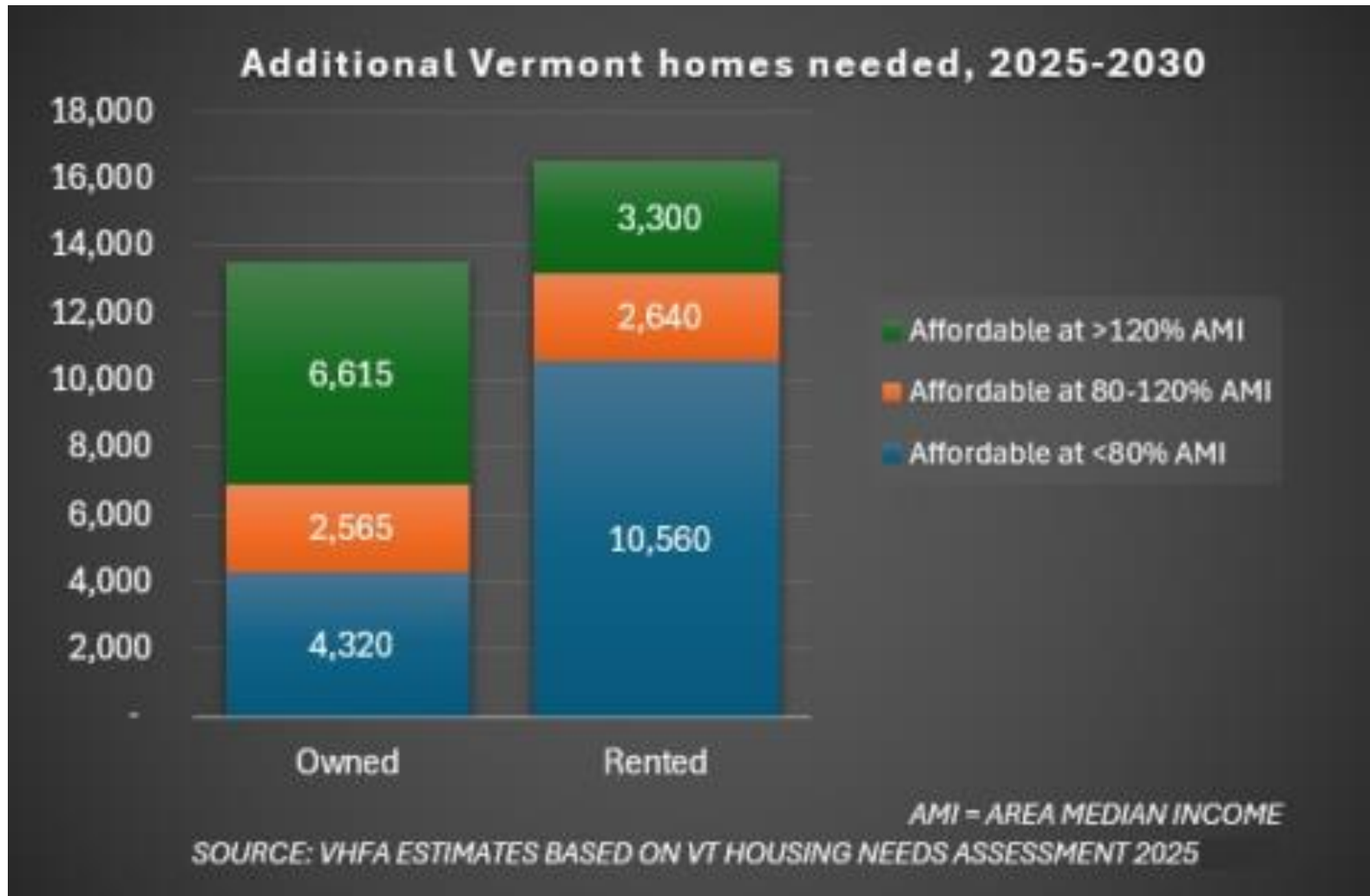
Cost burden level

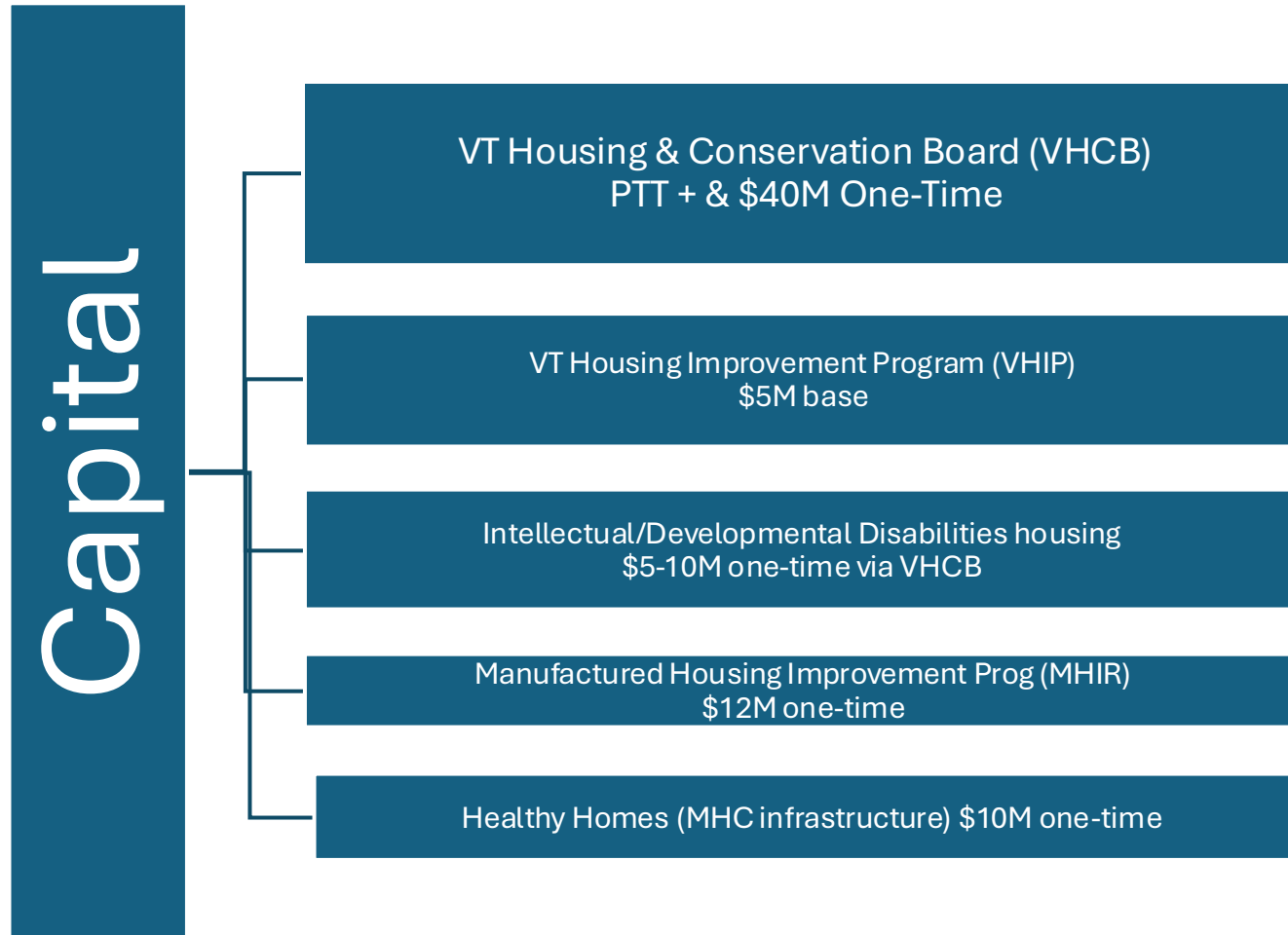


# Homes needed by 2030

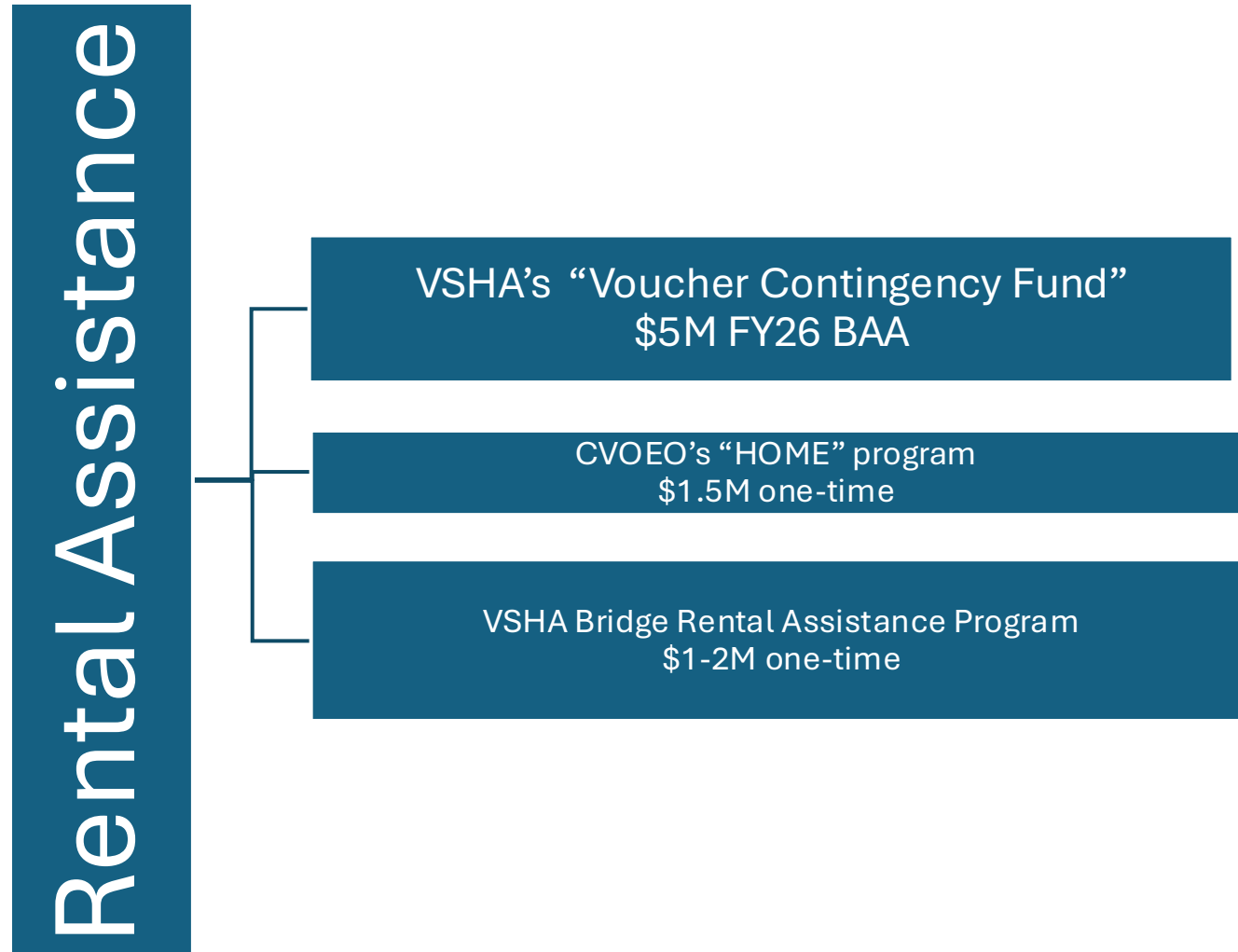

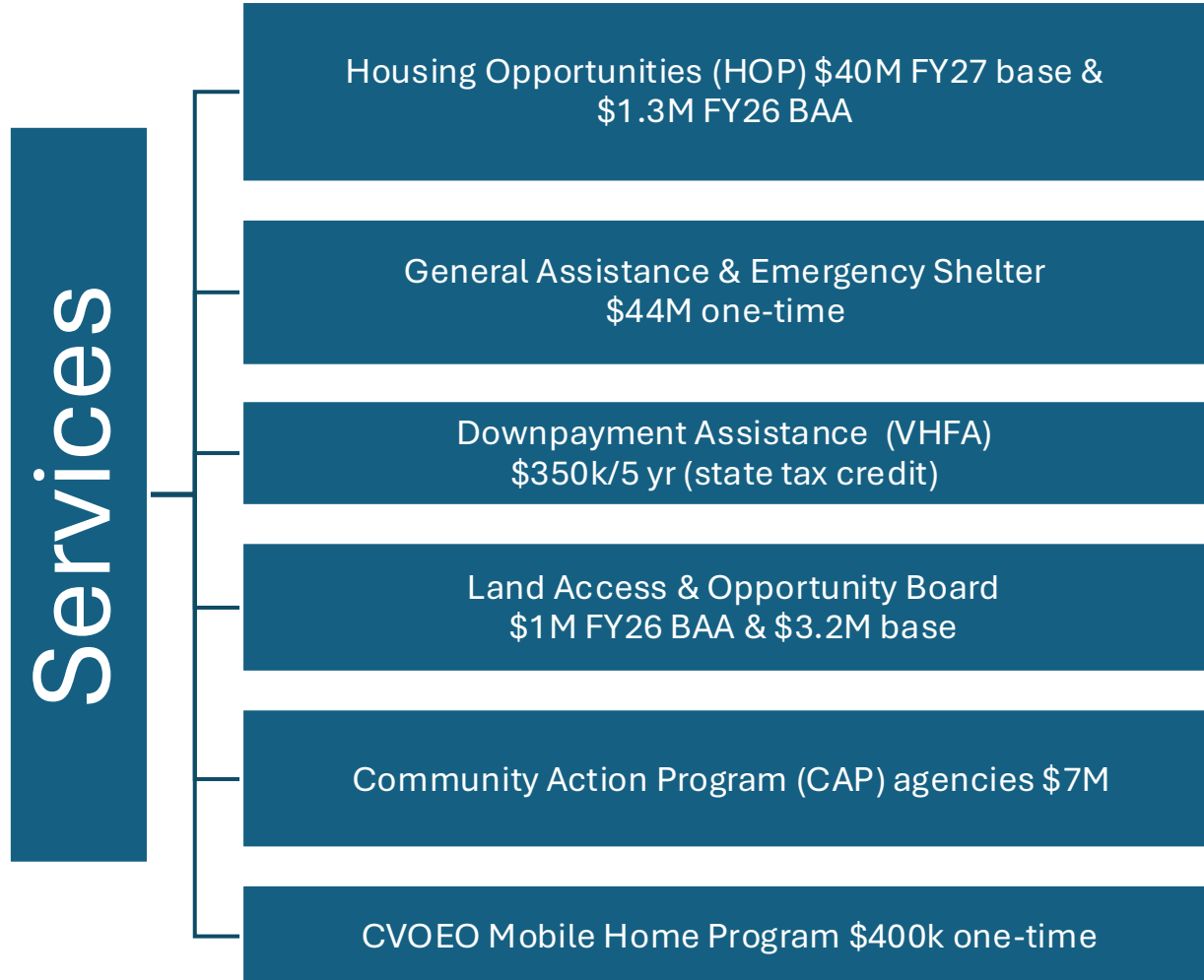
