- 1. Add the following language to Sec. 1 [draft 4.1, pg. 3]:
 - a. (iv) enact student-centered updates to career and technical education funding within a foundation formula that does not create competition between sending schools and career and technical education programs for available funds, nor exceed current spending levels;
- 2. Add the following language to the effective dates section
 - a. 16 V.S.A. § 4010(d)(5) shall take effect on July 1, 2029, contingent upon the General Assembly's receipt of:
 - i. the report required from the Agency of Education under Sec. 29, which shall include a plan to reduce extraordinary special education costs;
 - ii. the report required from the Joint Fiscal Office under Sec. 45a, which shall include a recommendation as to whether new special education weights shall be enacted; and
 - iii. an analysis by the Agency of Education regarding Vermont's compliance with the federal maintenance of effort and maintenance of financial obligation requirements under Vermont's new foundation formula.
- 3. Sec. 11. School Closure section [draft 4.1, pg. 36-37; side by side, pg. 16-17]
 - a. The House proposes reverting back to the language in Sec. 8 from the Senate's Proposal of Amendment
- 4. Add a requirement to Sec. 45a. [draft 4.1, pg. 91] to include a study of secondary weights within the foundation formula study
- 5. Accept the year faster timeline; offer contingent on inclusion of House property tax classification
- 6. Add two requirements to the Sec. 48a study [draft 4.1, pg. 107-108]:
 - a. examine the effects of allowing voters to approve spending more or less than a district's EOP would be calculated to be; and
 - b. if any town's tax rate is predicted to change significantly with the implementation of the foundation formula then the Dept. of Taxes shall recommend a solution to mitigate such changes, which the GA shall consider
