





Our Common Value:

Success in reading is an issue of equity.

We are committed to ensuring equity so our students grow to love reading and experience their highest potential through literacy instruction grounded in evidence-based practices.

Our Overarching Goals:

Upon the implementation of practice changes

- 80% of Mountain Views' students are proficient in reading* through Universal Tier 1 Core Instruction.
- 90% of Mountain Views' students are proficient or above in reading by the end of Grade 3** and remain proficient or above beyond Grade 3.

Our Approach:

- Research and evidence-based literacy practices drive our professional learning, interventions, instruction, curriculum and assessment decisions.
- Excellent Universal Tier 1 Core Instruction meets the needs of most students.
- Universal Design for Learning is a framework applied to all instructional planning ensuring prevention through instruction before intervention as well as engagement and relevance for students.
- Reliable, actionable data are regularly collected, and results are accessible and referenced for schoolwide decisions and classroom instruction.
- Skilled Interventionists and Special Educators support tiered instruction aligned with the core curriculum.
- Systemic and ongoing evidence-based professional learning for educators.
- Build student knowledge of the world through the integration of literacy with content from a variety of content areas and cultures.




2023 Youth Risk Behavior Survey: Selected High School Measures, MVSU

High school students in Mountain Views SU demonstrate strong protective factors including belonging and parental engagement. These factors have been linked to lower substance use and higher levels of post-secondary schooling.






