### Medicaid School-Based Services (SBS) Program Overview

- Medicaid pays for medically necessary health services and Medicaid administrative claiming (MAC) activities provided to eligible students in Vermont schools.
- To be eligible for Medicaid reimbursement for health services provided in the school setting, a student must:
  - Have an Individualized Education Plan (IEP) or Individualized Family Service Plan (IFSP) that includes the medically necessary health service(s), and
  - Be enrolled in Vermont Medicaid
- Medicaid payments are made to school Supervisory Unions (SUs) or Local Education
   Agencies (LEAs), as school staff are the providers of health services and MAC activities.
- All LEAs actively participate in the Medicaid SBS program.

**Students Receiving Special Education Services** 


~73% are Medicaid eligible

### **SBHS Medicaid Funding Flow**

Education Medicaid Receipts – 16 V.S.A. § 2959a

Federal revenue from the SBHS program supports both School Districts and the State

- 50% granted by AOE to Supervisory Unions / School Districts
  - Paid out by AOE in five grant payments each fiscal year
  - Amount is proportional to paid claims
  - Funds must be used for intervention or prevention programs, reported to AOE
- 50% retained by the State of Vermont
  - Up to 30% may be used by AHS and AOE for program admin costs
    - As appropriated by the General Assembly
  - Any remaining funds are deposited into the Education Fund
