4	It is hereby enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Vermont:
5	Sec. 1. CHARTER AMENDMENT APPROVAL
6	The General Assembly approves the amendments to the charter of the City
7	of Barre as set forth in this act. The voters of the City approved the
8	amendments on May 14, 2024.
9	Sec. 2. 24 App. V.S.A. chapter 1 is amended to read:
10	CHAPTER 1. CITY OF BARRE
11	* * *
12	§ 110. FISCAL YEAR
13	The fiscal year of the City and the City School District shall begin on the
14	first day of July and end on the last day of June of each calendar year. The
15	fiscal year shall constitute the budget and accounting year as used in this
16	charter.
17	§ 111. BONDING OF CITY OFFICIALS
18	The Mayor, councilors, members of the Police Department, City Manager,
19	Finance Director, Superintendent of Public Works, Tax Collector, and Clerk,
20	and Treasurer shall annually be bonded by the City for the faithful discharge of

1	their respective duties, as provided by State statute, and the expense of said
2	bonds to be paid by the City.
3	* * *
4	§ 202. TIME OF ELECTIONS AND MEETINGS
5	(a) The annual City meeting of the City for the election of officers, the
6	voting of budgets, and any other business included in the warnings for the
7	meeting, shall be held on the first second Tuesday in March May, unless
8	otherwise legally warned by the Council.
9	* * *
10	§ 203. SPECIAL CITY AND SCHOOL DISTRICT MEETINGS
11	Special City meetings and Special School District meetings shall be called
12	in the manner provided by the laws of the State, and the voting on all questions
13	shall be by the Australian ballot system, except for budget votes as provided in
14	section 207(d).
15	* * *
16	§ 205. OFFICERS ELECTED
17	(a)(1) The legal voters shall elect biennially a Mayor and one person to
18	serve as a Clerk and Treasurer.
19	* * *
20	(3) Annually, the legal voters shall elect school commissioners to serve
21	for a term of three years, as follows:

1	(A) at the 2019 annual City meeting, and each successive three-year
2	eycle after that, three school commissioners;
3	(B) at the 2020 annual City meeting, and each successive three-year
4	eycle after that, two school commissioners;
5	(C) at the 2021 annual City meeting, and each successive three year
6	eycle after that, two school commissioners. [Repealed.]
7	(b) The legal voters shall elect annually Spaulding Union High School
8	District School Board members in the manner, number, and term limit as is
9	specified in the Barre City/Barre Town Union High School Agreement, dated
10	November 30, 1986, or any such successor document. [Repealed.]
11	§ 206. VACANCIES
12	(a) In case of vacancy of any elected municipal City officer, except a
13	councilor or school commissioner, occasioned by death, removal from the
14	City, resignation, or inability to serve, such vacancy, unless herein otherwise
15	provided, shall be filled by appointment by the City Council until the next
16	annual election. In such case, nomination may be made by any member for the
17	Council.
18	* * *
19	(c) In case of a vacancy of any school commissioner, occasioned by death,
20	removal from the City, resignation, or inability to serve, such vacancy, unless
21	herein otherwise provided, shall be filled by appointment by the remaining

1	members of the School Board until the next annual election. In such case,
2	nomination may be made by any member of the School Board. [Repealed.]
3	§ 207. VOTING ON REQUEST OF THE CITY MANAGER
4	(a) Annually, on the first second Tuesday in March May, the legal voters of
5	the City shall meet to vote on the requests of the City Manager.
6	(b) If, at the annual March meeting, the voters disapprove the request of the
7	City Manager, the Mayor, or in his or her absence or disability, the City Clerk,
8	shall warn a general meeting of the legal voters to consider the article
9	disapproved by the voters and to authorize a specific sum of money therefor.
10	The meeting shall be in accordance with 17 V.S.A. §§ 2630–2689 and shall be
11	held at the same location as the previous meeting with the polls open for the
12	same hours as the previous meeting. If the voters continue to disapprove any
13	portion of the request, similar meetings shall be held in the same manner.
14	* * *
15	§ 301. GOVERNING BODY
16	The City shall be governed by an elected Council and by an appointed City
17	Manager and by such other officers and employees as may be duly appointed
18	pursuant to this charter, City ordinances, or general laws of the State of
19	Vermont.

1	(2) Within the limitations of the foregoing, the Council shall have the
2	power to:
3	* * *
4	(B) appoint and remove a Treasurer, and such Assistant Treasurers as
5	shall be deemed necessary, who shall be responsible for the performance of all
6	duties of a municipal treasurer under State law;
7	(C) assign additional duties to offices, commissions, or departments
8	established by this charter, but may not discontinue or assign to any other
9	office, commission, or department duties assigned to a particular office,
10	commission, or department established by this charter;
11	(C)(D) make, amend, and repeal ordinances; and
12	(D)(E) adopt an official seal of the City.

14	§ 315. COMPENSATION OF CITY OFFICIALS
15	Compensation of Mayor, councilors, and other appointees and City officers:
16	* * *
17	(3) When the legal voters have authorized an annual City and school
18	budget, the City Council, School Board, and/or or the City Manager shall not
19	authorize appropriations, expenditures, or payment in excess of the amount
20	voted. Deficit spending shall be prohibited by the City of Barre and the City of
21	Barre Schools.

3	24 App. V.S.A. chapter 1, §§ 413 (School District), 516 (powers and duties
4	of Board of School Commissioners), and 517 (appointment of superintendent
5	and principal) are repealed.
